

Library

At MAC, the Library is a holistic space to further augment our intellectual acumen. Housed on two floors, it is well furnished with comfortable chairs and tables for students and teachers. It is well stocked with books, magazines, periodicals and journals to enhance and extend the process of learning. Modern racks are fitted to facilitate book storage and browsing. The entire library is Wi-Fi enabled to allow students access to the internet for their academic development.

ICT Centre

The Centre caters to the curriculum requirements of computer practical for various courses of study in the college. Alongside, the centre also runs a dedicated general purpose computer lab where faculty, students and staff can utilize computing facilities at their convenience. The general purpose lab provides a heterogeneous environment with Windows 7, Mac OS X and Linux Operating System. The Centre also provides a secure Wi-Fi network to all the students, staff and faculty members of the college.

The college has a fully functional Media Centre with high definition equipment and in-house professional expertise in order to impart pre-production and post-production training to students of Journalism. Besides, it is also used for film screenings, short film making workshops and conducting seminars and conferences on different aspects of media studies and journalism.

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Auditorium

The high tech auditorium is housed in a separate complex spread over three floors. It has the capacity to accommodate 700 students. Conference Room



The ultra-modern Conference Room of the College has an excellent sound system, overhead projector and other facilities. Climate Change, National Conferences on Media Literacy: Progression and Challenges in Developing Countries, National Student Academic Congress was also proudly hosted by the college in the previous academic session.

Girls' Hostel

In any institution, a residential accommodation for students, especially girls, is always an asset. "Vidyottama" the Girls' Hostel of Maharaj Agrasen College can accommodate around fifty (50) students on its three floors and has separate area for dining and common room on the ground floor. Besides, a pantry has been provided on each floor. The Hostel is fined with several amenities like television, washing machine, water heaters, ironing facilities, electric stove etc. The hostel is Wife enabled and computers are available for the use of the residents.

Admissions to the hostel take place strictly on the basis of merit. Interested outstation girl students should keep visiting college website for information regarding admission to the hostel and other queries.

Sports Facilities

Maharaja Agrasen College provides diverse sports facilities with coaching and support to its students to participate in competitions as well as to pursue interest in sports. The college provides training in Athletics, Archery, Basketball, Badminton, Chess, Cricket, Cycling, Soccer, Korfball, Softball, Volley Ball and



Wushu. The Sports Committee of the college, in charge of supervising sports activities, organizes various sports and adventure activities regularly for the students, Teaching Staff and Non-Teaching Staff. The college also organizes its Annual Sports Festival, SPARDHA, where inter college sports competitions are held.

With the aim of encouraging the concept of physical fitness among the students and staff-members, the College has a well-equipped gym (MAC-Wellness Centre) with some of the best exercising machines. The gym is accessible to all students and staff-members in the morning hours with an added advantage to the hostel students, since they can access the gym even during the evening. Students may take out time to make the most of the gym facility and burn extra calories for overall fitness.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

NSS, ever since its inception in the year 2013 has been working towards the holistic development of the students. Keeping in view the motto 'Not Me But You'- an idea which dates back to the times of Mahatma Gandhi who insisted upon social responsibility, the volunteers registered in NSS unit render community service both inside and outside the college premises. This community service enhances leadership, organizational and management skills among the students. MAC-NSS allows the students to gain perspective on understanding the association of an individual to one's community and hence develop competence in sharing of responsibilities among a larger group.

MAC - NSS volunteers generally work in the college in various research projects, on innovative ideas, with villages, slums and voluntary agencies to complete 120 hours of regular activities during an academic year.

(3) Maharaja Agrasen College Student Aid Fund

The college provides financial assistance under student Aid Fund to needy students with weak financial background whose Annual Parental income does not exceeds a maximum of Rs.2 Lakhs. Those interested must visit the college website to check the eligibility criterion for registration.

(4) Shri Sultan Chand Memorial Scholarship

A scholarship of Rupees Three Thousand Five Hundred (3500/-) per annum shall be awarded every year to a student of B.Com Hons. IIIrd year. The scholarship shall be awarded strictly by merit to a student of B.Com Hons III year who secures the second highest percentage of marks, being above Seventy (70% Aggregate of internal and external in all the papers), in the college in B.Com. (Hons) II year University examination in the first attempt in the year immediately preceding.

Centre for Performing Arts and Cultural Studies

The Centre for Performing Arts and Cultural Studies (CPACS) run by English Department of Maharaja Agrasen College seeks to promote performing arts and performance and cultural studies through its focus on image, direction, film, censorship, script, multimedia, narrative, play, intelligence, creativity and other related areas. The Centre has also established a cell called LETTER (Learn through Theatre) which held 32 sessions with 40 students of first year in previous year on personality development through theatre exercises leading to their review of physical and cognitive development.

Sanskriti Kala Kendra

The Hindi Department has started with a Sanskriti Kala Kendra with the aim of the overall development of the students. Besides giving them bookish knowledge, the centre focuses to inculcate cultural and moral values among students. Maharaja Agrasen College has initiated a long-term educational and cultural exchange program with Tokyo University of Foreign Studies, Tokyo, Japan. Twenty one students accompanied by faculty members visited Maharaja Agrasen College on 22nd February 2016 and later visited Agra and Amritsar. The students and faculty were from the Department of South Asian Studies and Social Education Centre for World Languages, Tokyo University. The Japanese students and faculty appreciated the diversity of Indian Culture and Languages and expressed keen interest in the different subjects of study in the University of Delhi.

Civic Education Centre

The Centre aims for effective promotion of commitment to the Constitution of India and good citizenship in the capital and the country through education. The project is funded by the Government of NCT of Delhi and translates student and teacher materials in Hindi. It initiates and sustains the "Leadership Development Camp" and several such activities in Delhi. In order to create a cadre of ideal educators, the Centre develops and implements Teacher Training Programmes on Civic Education. Creating and implementing Monitoring and Evaluation Mechanisms, publishing research related materials,



developing standards and curriculum framework and the implementation of Leadership and Network Training Programmes are some of the goals which have been taken up by the Centre to promote Civic Education in India. The Centre plans to develop and sustain its relationship with other stakeholders – namely the Department of Education, colleges, schools, homes and local government officials – to strengthen civic values in India.

Training and Placement Cell

The Placement Cell at Maharaja Agrasen College is dedicated towards giving its students opportunities to build their career before they have crossed the threshold of the college. The Placement Cell coordinates with the Central Placement Cell of the University of Delhi and conducts Placement drives wherein different established companies like Tata Power Delhi Distribution, SP Capital IQ. Accenture, Anhad Edutrain Solutions Pvt Ltd, Urban Clap-Talocity, Digital Web Solutions Pvt Ltd etc., take part for student recruitments. The cell has tied up with Times of India, Indian Railways, Leo Burnett, Macmillian and other such institutions to provide internship opportunities for the students. The cell also organizes workshops and training programmes in order to help students develop their personalities and learn better skills to ensure employability in the competitive job market. It is the mission of the T&P cell to strive to bring in more and more recruiters in order to facilitate maximum placements from the college and establish a benchmark in this righteous pursuit.

College Publications

The academic community of the college is alive to the need of bringing out in house publications as well. The college publishes research journal 'The Indian Journal of Social Enquiry' which has earned a pride of place in the annals of research journals in the country. The Department of Business Economics brings out its annual journal 'BEAM' which gives the students an opportunity to publish and showcase their knowledge and throws light on current business developments, the Department of Journalism regularly published its newsletter 'MAC VOICE'. The entire process of editing and designing its carried out solely by the students, so that they can understand the concept of Journalism from the news gathering to its circulation. 'AGRANIKA', the college magazine, mirrors the spirit of Maharaja Agrasen College community. It is a canvast for expressing creativity and exists as a record of college life for a session. It is published annually and is released on the Annual Day in the College.

Environmental Clubs

MAC INSERCH (Maharaja Agrasen College Initiative for Shouldering Ecological Responsibility and Conserving Heritage) is an initiative by the students, teachers and administrative staff of the College who are committed to the cause of environmental and heritage conservation and development. It is led by a strong team of over 25 teaching and administrative staff and 50 student volunteers who incessantly work round the year for the realization of the stated objectives of the club.

This initiative was started in 2011 and in a span of six years, it has made a significant difference in the environmental life of the college by way of planting trees, organizing poster making and best out of the waste competitions, Soup and Salad Party in order to promote organicism, five National Conferences on Biodiversity and Climate Change, conducting Tree Audit for the College, various energy conservation measures and visit to various places of historic interest and ecological importance.

Students can join this movement and contribute a lot by becoming volunteers who would be suitably rewarded at the end of the academic session with commendation certificates and prizes. A Green Gown Award for the best student volunteer is also being instituted from the current academic session.

Trishul Adventure Club

Trishul Adventure Club of Maharaja Agrasen College is named after a group of three Himalayan Mountain Peaks which resemble a Trishul. Challenging experiences helps the students promote the development of inner balance, essential for effective communication, solving problem and decision making skills. The students also learn to keep the mountains clean as it is by not littering anything on their way. Participant's horizons are broadened, new challenges come to be relished rather than shunned, perseverance and determination reinforced. Values and attitudes developed in context of shared endeavor help to form a sound basis for responsible citizen. Trust, care, tolerance and willingness to give and support are all encouraged and anti-social behavior is challenged. Opportunities are presented to exhibit and develop effective inter-

personal behavior and to work co-operatively and effectively in teams. The experiences in the mountains far from busy city tile helps the students to understand more deeply about the importance of clean and healthy nature. Trishul Adventure Club had a path breaking. Knari Pass Trek in April, 2017 with a team of twenty five which built a strong foundation for more adventure activities in the College. The club organizes a trek from time to time to imprint such good experiences in their life.

Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Research Centre

Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Research Centre is the latest addition in the initiatives taken up by the college. The Centre strives to prepare our students for future competencies and equip them with state-of-the-art infrastructural facilities and able guidance. It serves as a one stop space for nurturing the fresh innovative ideas from students/faculties into a well-defined research or practice or a start-up initiative. The Centre aims to provide round the clock infrastructural and IT support as well as brainstorming sessions with faculty/industry persons to refine the naive ideas and may provide financial support to selected ventures. The college in the past academic session has successfully completed 10 innovation projects. Maharaja Agrasen College manages different projects under Star Innovation Project scheme and Innovation Project Scheme, which are fully funded by the University of Delhi. The details of these projects are as follow:

Star Innovation Projects(SIP): A number of research projects have been initiated under Star Innovation Project. These projects are student-centric research activities under guidance of teachers from different departments and are of three years duration.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was set up in Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi on October 3, 2015 in response to the latest set of guidelines laid down by NAAC for the setting up of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell in higher institutions. The IQAC 2016-17 comprises of the Principal as Chairperson and Dr Maneesha as the Coordinator along with teachers-in-charge, alumni members and representatives from industry. The MAC-IQAC is committed towards enhancing the academic and research environment of the college. In 2015-16, the IQAC had initiated a proactive and meaningful dialogue with all stakeholders of the institute by organizing interdisciplinary workshops, Friday faculty Research Seminar Series and a Seminar on "Practising Quality Culture in Institutions of Higher Education" in the year 2016. A debate Shiksha Vyavastha Ka Uddeshya Gunvatta moolyon par aadharit ho?" on Quality Culture was organized by the Department of Hindi under the aegis of its Navchetna Parishad and the key theme of the 4th National Student's Academic Congress was on "Quality Assurance in Higher Education" in which around 45 papers from undergraduate and graduate students, and PhD research scholars were presented on different broad aspects of Quality Assurance for example: Quality Assurance: India and the World, Interface with Technology & Technical Information, and Public-Private Partnerships.

Apart from the above, the Institute has initiated periodical result analysis by the departments followed by remedial measures, has brought in reforms in the conduct of examinations and is committed to raising the bar of quality education. Furthermore, feedback from students is now regularly elicited both in matters of administration and academics. Student feedback after a conference or special talk organized by a department helps departments plan their academic and co-curricular activities to offer a holistic development. Students are the foundation of the institution and their needs and aspirations are factored not only in academic planning but also in administrative reforms.

Departments plan their academic calendar much in advance and ensure that all co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are in tandem with teaching, they are now scheduled for the second half of the semester, during the second half of the week/day. This ensures uninterrupted teaching and timely completion of syllabi. Several suggestions by the NAAC Peer Team are also in the process of being implemented such as ERP solutions (Student Management System) in order to smoothen the interface between the college and all stakeholders, implementing the Choice Based Credit System in both letter and spirit and introducing add on courses.

The MAC IQAC believes in a participatory approach, in engaging all stakeholders in its endeavor to help the institute evolve constantly. Students, parents and alumni are encouraged to give their suggestions, to proactively help to take MAC to greater heights.

Guidelines for admission

The following guidelines of admission to various undergraduate courses for the academic session 2017-2018 will be followed:

- Student is advised to visit http://du.ac.in for detailed information. The college will admit all the candidates who have percentage that meet the announced cut-off criteria. No first-come-first served policy is adopted.
- The applicants who meet the requisite cut-off should login to the UG admission portal into their registration account and select college/Programme where the Applicant wishes to take admission and meets the desired cut-off criterion
- The Applicant shall take the print out of the admission form and together with the list of documents/certificates (
 See List of Documents Required) and proceed to the respective college for verification of mark-sheet/certificates, calculation of cut-off percentage depending on the programme/course as per the the schedule for verification of documents in the colleges.
- The college will retain the certificates of approved Applicant in order to avoid multiple admissions. The certificates will
 remain with the colleges during the admission process. However, the colleges shall promptly return the documents
 in case student withdraws/cancels the admission or student wishes to appear in counselling of any other university/
 institute.
- After this, the college will approve the admission on the UG admission portal. The Applicant will then be required to
 log-on to the UG admission portal to make the online Admission Fee payment through the available online payment
 options. The approved Applicant is permitted to make online admission fee payment till 12 noon of the next day of the
 given admission list deadline (see Section 2.3 of University bulletin).
- It may be noted that your admission in a college is completed only after payment of the online admission fee on the UG admission portal within the prescribed time-limit.
- Applicant can take admission only in one Programme in one college at any given time. In case a student wishes to withdraw/cancel the admission in a Programme/college, the Applicant should approach the college where the admission is taken. Only after the college cancels the admission of a applicant, the applicant can proceed to take admission in other Programme/college. Admission fee will be adjusted automatically and student will pay the balance fee if the fee is more in the new college/Programme in which he took the admission. In case the fee is less in the per the college in which applicant took the admission, the balance would be refunded to the Applicant account as per the College/University rules after the admissions are closed

- (a) The applicants who could not take admission in a given cut-off list can be considered for admission in the immediate next cut-off list only on the last date of admission, subject to availability of seats.
- (b) For Boards, like International Baccalaureate and others, whose results are declared late, applicants may be considered in whichever cut-off list their results are declared, subject to availability of seats and provided the Applicant had completed the online registration process.
- Gap year(s) would be no bar for the purpose of admission to the undergraduate Programmes.
 - The applicants seeking admission under ECA category may check the Section 9.29.8.1 and Annexure III of University bulletin for further details.
 - The applicants seeking admission under Sports category may check the Section 9.29.8.2 and Annexure IV of University bulletin for further details.
 - iii. For BBE Course admission will be done through Joint Admission Test.

Requirements for Admission

Qualifying Examinations

Qualifying examinations for the purpose of admission to the first year of undergraduate programmes offered by the University of Delhi shall be Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (Class XII) of the Central Board of Secondary Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto.

Applicants seeking admission to the programmes offered by the University should have passed the qualifying examination obtaining minimum marks as specified for each of the programmes in subsequent sections.

Age Requirement

As per Ordinance-I of the University of Delhi, there is no minimum age bar for admission to the under- graduate and postgraduate programmes in the University and its colleges except in the programmes where the respective regulatory bodies, such as Medical Council of India (MCI), All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), Bar Council of India (BCI), National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), Dental Council of India (DCI), etc. have prescribed the minimum age requirement in their regulations.

Basis of calculation of Best Four

- Mass Media Studies will be treated as an academic subject for the purpose of admission to B.A. (Hons.) Journalism (Hindi/ English).
- In case an applicant has studied elective and core languages, the core language subject will be treated as language, while
 elective language can be considered as academic/ elective subject.
- Admission to B.A. (Hons.) Applied Psychology will be based on 'Best Four' percentage as in B.A. (Hons.) Psychology.
- Admission to B.A. (Hons.) Social Work and B.A. (Hons.) Philosophy will be based on 'Best Four' percentage including
 one language and three academic/elective subjects as per the above procedure.
- The applicants must have studied and passed Mathematics at the qualifying exam for admission to B.A. (Honours) in Economics.
- (a) For admission to Honours in any language programme, advantage of 2% in the 'Best Four' percentage will be given
 to those applicants who have studied that particular elective language.
- (b) In case, an applicant has not studied a language at qualifying exam and is seeking admission to Honours in that language (except for Honours in English and Hindi, refer (c)), deduction of 5% will be imposed on 'Best Four' percentage.
- (c) For admission to Honours in English and Hindi, the applicant must have studied and passed the respective language in the qualifying exam and should include respective language for calculation of 'Best Four' percentage.
- 7. University may define any other relevant subjects as an academic/ elective for a particular Honours programme.

II. B. Com. (Hons):

a. One Language from Part 1 of List C1 + three best subjects out of Part 2 of List C1.

OR

One Language from Part 1 of List C1 + any combination of subjects out of Part 2 of List C1, List C2 or any other subject (not listed either in List C1 or List C2). In such a case, the deduction of marks from aggregate percentage of 'Best Four' shall be as follows:

- b. For every subject included from List C2, a deduction of one percent in aggregate percentage of 'Best Four':
- c. For every other subject (not listed either in List C1 or List C2), a deduction of 2.5% per subject in aggregate percentage of 'Best Four'.

Note:

- i. All subjects to be included in the calculation of 'Best Four' must have at least 70% theory component of examination. In case the subject to be considered does not have at least 70% theory component, then the marks obtained theory and practical shall be converted to 70% and 30% respectively, on pro rata basis. The marks so a rived at will then be considered for calculation of 'Best Four'.
- The applicant must have studied and passed Mathematics/Business Mathematics at the qualifying examination for admission to B. Com. (Hons.).
- iii. The computation of 'best four' subjects in the above framework should lead to an effective and unique 'best four' which would be higher than any other combination of 'best four' subjects.

- ii. If more than one non-listed subject is included for calculation of 'Best Four', a deduction of 2.5% each in 'Best Four' may be levied in addition to deduction due to change of stream, if any.
- iii. All subjects to be included in the calculation of 'Best Four' must have at least 70% theory component of exam. In case, the subject to be considered does not have 70% theory component and 30% practical component, then the marks of theory and practical only shall be converted to 70% and 30%, respectively on pro rata basis. These new marks will then be considered for calculation of 'Best Four' in addition to Note (i).

IV. Science Programmes

- a. The Basis of Selection for Mathematical Sciences is listed in Section 5.3 of University bulletin. (i.e. Selection will be made on the basis of best four academic subjects including One Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry / Computer Science / Informatics Practices. The students of other streams: one Language, Mathematics with two Academic Subjects List (LIST A) with a deduction of 2%.) All the subjects to be included for Basis of Selection (PCM/PCB/PCMB) must have at least 70% theory component of examination. In case, the subject to be considered does not have 70% theory component and 30% practical component, then the marks of theory and practical only must be converted to 70% and 30%; respectively on pro rata basis. These new marks will then be considered for calculation of PCM/PCB etc.
- For BSc (H) Electronics, Selection will be made on the basis of marks in the aggregate of 3 Science subjects as mentioned in column 3 of University bulletin for each Honours Programme


The Honours course in English at Maharaja Agrasen College was introduced in 1997. The B. A (Hons.) English course aims to provide an exposure to a spectrum of global literatures and students are trained in various methods of literary analysis. The department has consistently provided opportunity to students for interacting with some of the most renowned scholars, critics, artists and thinkers. The Department of English has systems in place to ensure delivery of quality teaching, transparent mechanisms for internal assessment and structured preparation for University examination as well as orientation for future preparation for diverse fields and professions. The faculty of the Department of English regularly makes wide contribution to the corporate life of the College- extending thereby the reach of the students through involving them in College events at various levels.

The Department of English has a full calendar of activities aimed towards making students connect not just with the literary world but also to the larger world beyond their immediate and classroom ambit. The Department has its own departmental library as well as rich reserve of resource in its Centre for Performing Arts and Cultural Studies (CFPACS). The Department of English Co-curricular Student Society 'ACTIVE' lives up to its name each year by organising and participating in many well attended events under the guidance of the teachers. Student office-bearers of ACTIVE are appointed through a



democratic process. The Co-curricular events include The Annual Lecture Series, Literature Festival, Meet the Author Series, Workshops, Excursion to places of cultural interest like the Jaipur Literary Festival (last year it was the cultural/ecological site of Sattal nature camp and community excursion). Heritage Walk (to historic sites of the revolt of 1857 in Old Delhi this February), exhibitions, theatre and movie viewing (plays watched include Aresteia by Aeshylus and Mrichchakatika by Sudraka at NSD; films screened include 12 Years a Slave, Twelfth Night and Silence! The Court is in Session among others) and other such projects. The Department has been organising interdisciplinary conferences: International Conference Deterritorialising Diversities: Cultures, Literatures and Languages of the Indigenous (February, 2013); National Conference City Lives: Spaces and Narratives (February, 2016); and National Conference Reading Migrations: Fractured Histories, Forged Narratives (March, 2017).

With the introduction of the CBCS curriculum, the department has successfully offered Generic Elective papers on 'Text and Performance', 'Academic Writing' and 'Media and Communication Skills' as well as 'Creative Writing' and 'Technical Writing' as Skill Enhancement Courses, eliciting very enthusiastic response from students of various streams. 


Other departments that offer papers for Political Science students are English, Hindi, Economics and History.


Media industry needs more 'skilled' workforce, NSQF qualified learners will be able to meet the challenges offered by contemporary media industry.

The curriculum of this course is designed to equip the students with an intellectual and inter-disciplinary approach that prepares them for the Industry. The learning process aims to strike a balance between the theoretical and practical approach to the field. Syllabus of the course will be in alignment with National Occupational Standard of the Sector Skills Council and NVEQF / NSQF. Syllabus has been developed in consultation with the industry professionals, academicians & media & entertainment sector skill council. In order to make education relevant and to create 'industry fit' skilled workforce, the college will be in constant dialogue with the industry, so that they remain updated on the requirements of the workforce in the industry.

The course offers credit-based modular programmes, wherein banking of credits is permitted so as to enable multiple exit and entry. This would enable the learner to seek employment after any level of certification and join back as and when feasible to upgrade her/his qualification/skill competency either to move higher in her/his job or in the higher educational system. This will also provide the learner an opportunity to move from vocational stream to general stream and vice-verse, subject to fulfilling the entry qualifications.

ATTENDANCE

- All Courses taught in the college shall be taught in the Semester System as per University of Delhi Guideline and Curricula.
- 2. According to Ordinance VII (2)* of the University of Delhi, a candidate for the Semester I/III/V Examination shall not be deemed to have satisfied the required conditions of attendance unless s/he has attended, in all the subjects taken together, not less than two thirds of the lectures/practical/presentations/tutorials required to be attended provided that a student of the Semester I/III/V who does not fulfil the required conditions of attendance, as above, but has attended, in all the subjects taken together, not less than 40 percent of lectures/practical/presentations during the respective semester, may at the discretion of the Principal of the College concerned, appear for the ensuing semester Examination; but such a candidate shall be required to make up the deficiency at lectures and practicals, in the next semester of the same academic year.
- 3. Provided that a student of the II/IV semester who does not fulfill the required conditions of attendance as above, but has attended in all the subjects taken together, not less than 40 per cent of the lectures/practical presentation/tutorials, held during the respective semester, may at the discretion of the Principal of the College concerned, be allowed to appear at the ensuring examination provided that s/he makes up the deficiency of the said attendance by combining the attendance of the previous semester in the ensuing semester.
- The assessment marks for attendance are assigned as per the following guidelines:
 Less than 67% (0 Mark), More than 67% but less than 70% (1 Mark), More than 70% but less than 75% (2 Marks), More than 75% but less than 80% (3 Marks), More than 80% but less than 85% (4 Marks), More than 85% (5 Marks).

DISCIPLINE

- Students are responsible for their conduct to the Principal and are prohibited from doing anything, either inside the college or outside, that will amount to breach of discipline or interference in the normal working of the college. A student will be liable to disciplinary action for violation of any of the rules of discipline. Disciplinary actions may involve warning and/ or fines and/or suspension from the class, from examination, fromuse of the college library or even expulsion from the college as such or any such action as provided in ordinance XV-B, XV-C and XV-D of the rules of discipline of the University of Delhi. Disciplinary action may also involve non-issuance of character certificate when the student exits the course.
- Students shall conduct themselves in a disciplined manner both towards the members of the staff
 (Teaching and Non-Teaching) and towards their fellow students. In addition, unbecoming language or
 rude conduct shall be severely dealt with in accordance with the provisions leading to fine/ suspension/
 expulsion from the college as deemed fit by the Principal.
- Students shall maintain perfect discipline in class-rooms and desist from demonstration of disorderly
 behavior. They must not loiter in corridors or in front of class rooms or office rooms and must maintain
 silence. During their free periods, students must work quietly in the library or reading room but without
 causing any disturbance. Smoking in the College premises i.e. lawns, canteen, auditorium, class-rooms,
 corridors, staircases, library and reading room is strictly prohibited. Use of mobile phones and other
 audio devices are strictly prohibited in and around the class rooms. These will be confiscated by the
 college authorities and will be returned only at the end of the semester.
- Students shall take proper care of the college property and they must not spoil or cause any damage
 to or tamper or displace with college property, furniture, fitting etc. They shall not spoil the lawns.
 Students will have to pay the cost of damage/loss caused to the property of the college.
- Students shall leave their vehicles locked in the space provided for this purpose. No vehicle shall be left
 in any space other than the specified one. The College will not be responsible for any damage or loss on
 this account.
- No society can be formed in the college without the permission of the Principal. No person can be
 invited to address a meeting in the college or allowed to enter college without the prior permission of
 the Principal or allowed to use the name of the Principal or his office in any form as specified above.
- No student suffering from any contagious or infectious disease will be permitted to attend the college.
- Any student who is found impersonating or allowing impersonation on his/her behalf at the University
 Examination will stand expelled from the college with immediate effect. No letter calling for explanation
 or show cause notice will be issued to such student. No such student will be readmitted to the college.
- Outsiders are not allowed inside the college premises without permission of the college authorities. For
 the students, there shall be identity card entry in the college and they must produce their identity cards
 when asked.
- Smoking and consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited inside the college campus.
- Barring clause 7, violations of the above mentioned rules will lead to severe disciplinary action involving fine, suspension and expulsion from the college. The Principal can take such action even without assigning any reason.

ANTI-RAGGING MEASURES AT MAHARAJA AGRASEN COLLEGE

Ragging is totally prohibited in Maharaja Agrasen College as per the guidelines of University of Delhi

(Ordinance XV-C). Anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging whether actively or passively,or being a pan of conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with UGCRegulations2009as well as under the provisions of any penal law for the time being in force.

As per UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009,ragging constitute one ormore of any of following acts:

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by any act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- II. Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely tocause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- III. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- IV. Any act by senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- V. Exploiting the service of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- VI. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students
- VII. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and led acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health of person.
- VIII. Any act or abuse by spoken words, email, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from activity or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- IX. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

The Anti-Ragging Committee may punish a student found guilty of ragging with one or more of the

Following punishments:-

- 1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- II. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- III. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
- IV. Withholding marks
- V. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival,
 etc.
- VI. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
- VII. Cancellation of admission
- VIII. Rustication from the institution
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution of a specific period. Proved that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.


