Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Auditorium

The high tech auditorium is housed in a separate complex spread over three floors. It has the capacity to accommodate 700 students. Named after the Iron Man of India, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the auditorium is the hub of all cultural and extracurricular activities at the college. Conference Room



The ultra-modern Conference Room of the College is equipped with large size, ultra-high resolution interactive panel, an excellent sound system, overhead projector and other facilities. The conference room has enabled successful hosting of International, National Conferences and a series of Students Congresses along with facilitating student presentations. The Conference Room has been the venue for several National Conferences, namely, Indian Popular Fiction: Redefining the Canon, Higher Education Institutes: Knowledge Organisations, Reading Migrations: Fractured Histories, Forged Narratives, City Lives: Spaces and Narratives, Student Driven Research for Inspired Learning in

Science and Technology, India's Changing Role in the New World Order, Corporate Social Responsibility: Sports, Olympism and Global Peace, Biodiversity and Climate Change, Media Literacy: Progression and Challenges in Developing Countries and many more.

Vidyottama Girls' Hostel

In any institution, a residential accommodation for students, especially girls, is always an asset. 'Vidyottama' the Girls' Hostel of Maharaja Agrasen College can accommodate fifty eight students on its three floors and has separate areas for dining and common room on the ground floor. Besides, a pantry has been provided on each floor. The hostel is fitted with several amenities like television, washing machine, water heaters, ironing facilities, electric stove etc. The hostel is Wi-Fi enabled and computers are available for the use of the residents.

Admissions to the hostel take place strictly on the basis of merit. Interested outstation girl students should keep visiting the college website www.mac.du.ac.in for information regarding admission to the hostel and other queries.

Sports Facilities

Maharaja Agrasen College provides diverse sports facilities with coaching and training in Athletics, Archery, Basketball, Badminton, Chess, Cricket, Cycling, Soccer, Korfball, Softball, Volley Ball and Wushu. The Sports Committee of the College,



is in charge of supervising sports activities and organizes various sports and adventure activities regularly for the Students,

Teaching Staff and Non-Teaching Staff. The college also organizes its Annual Sports Festival, 'SPARDHA', wherein inter college sports competitions are held. With the aim of encouraging the concept of physical fitness among the students and staff-members, the College has a well-equipped gym (MAC-Wellness Centre), which is accessible to all students and staff-members in the morning hours with an added advantage

to the hostel students, since they can access the gym even during the evening. Our future projects are: 1.Lawn Tennis court with synthetic turf. 2. Viewer's gallery along basketball court. 3. 10 m pistol shooting range. 4. Aarogyam: Herbal garden with yoga and meditation parks and an open gym.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

NSS, ever since its inception in the year 2013 has been working towards the holistic development of the students. Keeping in view the motto 'Not Me But You'- an idea which dates back to the times of Mahatma Gandhi who insisted upon social responsibility, the volunteers registered in NSS unit render community service both inside and outside the college premises. The community service enhances leadership, organizational and management skills among the students. MAC-NSS allows the students to gain perspective on understanding the association of an individual to one's community and hence develop competencies in sharing of responsibilities among a larger group.

MAC - NSS volunteers work in various research projects, on innovative ideas, with villages, slums and voluntary agencies to complete mandatory 120 hours of regular activities during an academic year.

Few of the ongoing projects are:

Project ABHI (Agrasen Baroji Help Initiative) : Maharaja Agrasen College adopted a village, BAROJI, in Mewat, Haryana, in 2013. Students and faculty visit Baroji several times every year and have worked together with the residents of Baroji closely towards the holistic development of Baroji.

'Tassavvur', the Art and Photography Club as the name suggests encourages interest in all aspects of arts and photography for the benefit of the learning community of University of Delhi and the community at large.

Equal Opportunity Cell: This platform of MAC-NSS supports differently-abled, SC/ST members and students from economically weaker sections of its learning community.

Pedal Power Club seeks to maintain physical fitness, explore the great heritage sites of New Delhi and NCR and become more sustainable by decreasing one's environmental impact.

Agrani mobilizes young learners and encourages them to advance gender equality and women development.

Project AKSHAR, is all about imparting education. MAC-NSS Coordinator and student volunteers in this project deliver quality education to the underprivileged children in the vicinity. Approximately 60 to 90 students from nearby colonies like Dallupura and Kondli are enrolled in this project. A very well designed structure along with all the necessary teaching aids and a highly interactive pedagogical technique are used by the Team AKSHAR. Parent teacher interactions and tests are held regularly to evaluate their progress. The results have been highly encouraging.



National Cadet Corps (NCC)

NCC is the youth wing of the Indian Armed Forces with its headquarters in New Delhi. NCC is Tri-Services Organization, comprising the Army, Navy and Air Wing, engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens.

With its vision to empower volunteer youth to become potential leaders and responsible citizens of the country; it is open to school, college and university students all over India. Discipline and unity are the way of life and with this very motto our prestigious college has introduced NCC unit for the very first time in the academic session 2020-21.

The pandemic did not stop our college from putting this program into function after receiving the approval for raising the unit on 1 January 2021 with the company strength of 160. With active



cadets of 54, the unit started its different activities such as cleanliness drive, adoption of statues for maintenance, organising different events like expert lecture, international yoga day, environment day etc. Cadets proudly presented their first drill on 2021 Independence Day in the college. As the total company strength allotted to our college unit is 160, the vacancy of 53 is open for this session.



Library

At MAC, the Library is a holistic space to further augment our intellectual acumen. Housed on two floors, it is well furnished with comfortable chairs and tables for students and teachers. It houses more than 41750 books and 47000 National and International e-journals and other important e-resources related to Science and Technology, Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities, Commerce and Management. The library is fully managed by ALICE FOR WINDOW (library automation software). The library is subscribed with N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) which enables the users to access more than 5000 e-journals and e-books through a login username and password.

Students' Union

The Students' Union is the apex academic student representative body of the college formed to work for the welfare of

students by coordinating at the University level to actively organize academic and co-curricular events. The Students' Union of Maharaja Agrasen College is a democratically elected body. Academic merit, good attendance, sincerity, and leadership qualities present in students are the criteria for being elected to student's union.

Shri Sultan Chand Memorial Scholarship

A scholarship of Rupees Three Thousand Five Hundred (3500/-) per annum shall be awarded every year to a student of B.Com Hons. IIIrd year. The scholarship shall be awarded strictly by merit to a student of B.Com Hons III year who secures the second highest percentage of marks, being above Seventy (70% Aggregate of internal and external in all the papers), in the college in B.Com.(Hons) II year University examination in the first attempt in the year immediately preceding.

Apart from above mentioned scholarships, students may also apply for Shri Uggersain Memorial Endowment Scholarship, All India Entrance Scholarship Exams (DU) Entrance Based, Rector's Prize Exam 2016 (DU) Entrance based & Dr. VK Rao Endowment Book Grant.

SC/ST/OBC UGC-Cell

Maharaja Agrasen College is the study centre for Post-Graduate and Under-Graduate Courses offered by IGNOU. Classes are conducted during weekends for Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA), Bachelor of Commerce (BDP), Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.), Master of Commerce (M.Com), Management Program (MBA), Master of Arts in Hindi (MHD), Master of Arts in Political Science (MPS), Master of Arts in History (MAH), Master of Arts in English (MEG), Master of Science in Mathematics with Application in Computer Science (MSCMACS), Master in Public Administration (MPA), Post Graduate Diploma in Journalism and Mass Communication (PGJMC), Diploma in Teaching German (DTG), Certificate in Languages and others.



The CPACS run by the Department of English, Maharaja Agrasen College seeks to promote performing arts and performance and cultural studies through its focus on image, direction, film, censorship, script, multimedia, narrative, play, intelligence, creativity and other related areas. Shabad Sambhale Boliye, an anti-ragging short film of CPACS directed by the Centre coordinator and Activity Director Vinod Verma was screened and discussed for the freshers (2018-19) in the college auditorium for spreading anti-ragging awareness among the students. The movie was also screened in an international conference in IU Germany Gateway. The Centre has also established a cell called LETTER (Learn through Theatre) which held 32 sessions with 40 students of first year on personality development through theatre exercises leading to their review of physical and cognitive development.

Smart Class Rooms



Maharaja Agrasen College added another feather in its cap and paved way for next generation teaching-learning system by creating six smart classrooms in its premises. The smart classrooms are in line with the college's aim of providing holistic and quality education to all its students.

These classrooms will enhance virtual learning and teaching environments by offering real-time e-learning ambience, with help of audios and videos, multimedia images, online web conferences, PPT presentations, 2D & 3D animations, etc. This leads to the emergence of a more inclusive and interactive teaching-learning

scenario. This new age teaching-learning system will help in coalescing virtual and in-classroom teaching methodologies in multiple and innovative ways to afford easy accessibility for all. The smart classrooms were inaugurated by Vice Chancellor of University of Delhi, Prof P.C. Joshi on 10 September 2021 in presence of Dean of Colleges, Prof Balaram Pani, Principal, Prof Sanjeev Kumar Tiwari and other staff members of the college.

Sanskriti Kala Kendra

The Hindi Department had started a Sanskriti Kala Kendra with the aim of the overall development of the students. Besides giving them academic knowledge, the centre focuses to inculcate cultural and moral values among the students. Maharaja Agrasen College has initiated a long-term educational and cultural exchange program with Tokyo University of Foreign Studies, Tokyo, Japan. Apart from that centre organises various educational trips, Cultural Exchange Programmes and Seminar/ Symposium / Experts Lectures on Socio-cultural issues for overall development of the students.



Civic Education Centre

The Centre aims for effective promotion of commitment to the Constitution of India and good citizenship in the capital and the country through education. The project is funded by the Government of NCT of Delhi and translates student and teacher materials in Hindi. It initiates and sustains the "Leadership Development Camp" and several such activities in Delhi. In order to create a cadre of ideal educators, the Centre develops and implements Teacher Training Programmes on Civic Education. Creating and implementing 'Monitoring and Evaluation' Mechanisms, publishing research related materials, developing standards and curriculum framework and the implementation of Leadership and Network Training Programmes are some of the goals which have been taken up by the Centre to promote Civic Education in India. The Centre plans to develop and sustain its relationship with other stakeholders – namely the Department of Education, colleges, schools, homes and local government officials – to strengthen civic values in India.

College Publications

Step I: Registration on the UG portal.

All candidates seeking admission to the Undergraduate (UG) courses must register online on the University of Delhi UG Admission Portal www.admission.uod.ac.in

Step II: Payment of the registration fees

The application form will be deemed submitted only when the applicant has paid the relevant registration fee. This fee must be paid only through the link provided through the applicant's Dashboard.

Step III: Declaration of Cut-off

The University shall declare a minimum of five Cut-Offs. In case there are still some vacant seats left, the University may announce further Cut-Offs. If needed, the University may also conduct special drive(s) to fill vacant seats against unreserved/ reserved categories.

Step IV: Selection of Course and College

Upon declaration of the n-th Cut-Off list, applicants must log in to their Dashboards on the UG admission portal to choose the course and college they wish to claim admission in from the list of colleges and courses they are eligible for. During a cut-off list, the applicant is allowed to choose only one course and one college.

- *i.* Please note that selection of applicant's college and course can be made only online through their Dashboard on the UG admissions portal. There will be no physical visit to the colleges at this point in the process.
- *ii.* The procedure for choosing the course and the college by the applicant must be completed within the stipulated time interval.
- iii. Within a cut-off, the applicant will not be allowed to change his/ her choice of course and college.

Step V: Online verification of documents by respective colleges

The college shall verify the documents uploaded by the applicant for eligibility and meeting the required Cut-Off. Those approved are required to pay the fee and receive a confirmation of their admission.

Step VI: Payment of fees to confirm admission

Once the Principal of the College has approved their admission, the applicants will receive a link on their Dashboard on the UG Admissions portal through which they must submit the college/course fees due. This fee can only be paid online through the portal.

- *i.* The applicant is advised to pay the fee without delay within 24 hours of admission approval by the Principal of the College and save the acknowledgment slip. On successful payment of fees, the applicant is granted provisional admission to the said college.
- *ii.* Applicants must pay the fee within the timeframe allocated, failing which it will be concluded that the applicant is not interested in the course of study at that college, and the admission will be automatically cancelled.
- *iii.* Once the applicant has gained admission, they will have to sign an online declaration stating, "All the information I provided is correct. If any information provided by me is found to be false and/or is not supported by the documents presented by me, I understand that the admission will be immediately cancelled and no fees will be refunded. Furthermore, I shall abide by all the rules and regulations laid down by the University and the College."

Step VII: Physical verification of the original documents

The respective colleges will verify the uploaded documents within the stipulated time (Dates for the same shall be announced by the University / College later). If, at this stage, it is found that the information given by the applicant is false and/or is not supported by the documents presented, the admission will be immediately cancelled. No fees will be refunded in such cases.

Process for Change of Course / College in Subsequent Cut-Offs

If in subsequent lists, the applicant finds themselves eligible for admission to any other colleges/courses, they should ensure their eligibility by carefully examining the eligibility requirements of the Course/College/ Department.

- *i.* Applicants are advised to exercise extreme care to ensure that they meet the requirements for the Course/College. Once they are confident they wish to cancel admission in the course/college they initially had gained admission to in the previous list; the applicant must log in to the UG Admissions portal to cancel their admission through their Dashboard.
- *ii.* A cancellation fee will be levied, and they may now choose a new combination of course and college, subject to eligibility and meeting course-specific requirements.
- *iii.* Only one cancellation is allowed per the Cut-off list. Within a cut off the applicant will not be allowed to change his/ her choice of course and college. The total number of cancellations will be restricted to (n-1), where "n" is the total number of Cut-off Lists.

Qualifying Examinations:

Qualifying examinations for admission to the first year of undergraduate programs offered by the University of Delhi shall be Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (Class XII) of the Central Board of Secondary Education or an examination recognized as equivalent to that (Equivalence category would be in accordance with the University Information Bulletin Section 9.3). Applicants seeking admission to the programs offered by the University should have passed the qualifying examination obtaining minimum marks as specified for each of the programs in the eligibility section.

ORDINANCE XV-B: Maintenance of Discipline among Students of the University

- 1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor/Principal of the College.
- 2. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - a. Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution / Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
 - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons
 - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
 - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes
 - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women
 - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner
 - g. Willful destruction of institutional property
 - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
 - i. Disrupting in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
 - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
- 3. Without prejudice to the generality of her/his powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to her/him appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor / Principal, may in the exercise of her/his powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students-
 - (a) be expelled; or
 - (b) be, for a stated period rusticated; or
 - (c) be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in the College or

- (d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
- (e) be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which she / he or they have appeared be cancelled.
- 4. The Principals of the College shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments in the University as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Institutions. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.
- 5. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor/Principal as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself / herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he /she submits himself / herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor/Principal and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed there in by the University.

ORDINANCE XV-C: Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

- 1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College / Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- 2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- 3. 'Ragging' for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
 - a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
 - b. Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students.
 - c. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
 - d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
 - e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
- 4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- 5. Not with standing anything in Clause above, the Principal may also suo moto to enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the GB/Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- 6. The Principal of the College may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- 7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/ she may so advise the GB / Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- 8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/ her decision shall be final.
- 9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3 (a), (b) and (c) theVice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
- 10. The Vice-chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- 11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of the University of Delhi are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
- 12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
- 13. All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions /directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

ORDINANCE XV-D/The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace

(Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at work place and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental there to.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment;

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace. For details, please see the website

B. A. (Hons.) Business Economics

The objective of the B.A. (Honours) Business Economics course is to enable students develop analytical skills for effective decision making in the corporate world or equip them with sound theoretical knowledge to pursue higher studies at the Master's level in Business Economics, Economics or Management. In the rapidly changing market scenario, the need is to equip students with skills and capabilities to handle consumer, economic, financial and big data using dynamic modelling techniques. In order to achieve the above-mentioned objectives, a comprehensive syllabus comprising topics relating to economics, quantitative techniques, business and management are included in the three-year, six-semester module of the Bachelor's in Business Economics Course. The syllabus aims at giving wider coverage to its course contents, effective organisation of topics to enable easier assimilation of the same by the students, and a professional touch to the course.

The course exposes students to the areas of finance, marketing, econometrics and start-up skills within which businesses operate. Six discipline elective groups in finance, economics, quantitative techniques, marketing, new ventures and applied economics provide the students a wide array of areas to specialize in.

The department adopts a variety of pedagogical aproaches apart from the regular lectures, tutorials, project work and presentations. The department organises industrial seminars and workshops regularly. It encourages students to take up internship in industry and research establishments etc. with the aim of developing their problem-solving, communication and higher-order skills of reasoning and analysis.

The activity calendar of the department in the past years has included an orientation program for the freshers, corporate interactions, workshops on motivation and for developing leadership attributes, soft skills, start-up ideation and funding, business innovation during the pandemic etc. The department organises an 'Industrial colloquium' to impart skills of situation based decision making, trading and optimal utilization of a given budgetary resources.

The Magazine & Newsletter Committee of the department releases an e-newsletter every month. The committee has taken out several successful editions of the news letter called the BEA-Beats. 
The alumni of the department from diverse fields have addressed and guided the students regarding further education and career options available to them and real challenges in working for the industry and the government.

B. A. (Hons.) English

The B.A. Honours course in English at Maharaja Agrasen College was introduced in 1997. This is a highly sought-after course and justly so. With an entire panorama of literary texts, contexts and critical tools, it aims to provide students an exposure to a spectrum of global literatures and train them in various methods of literary and sociocultural analyses. The department has consistently provided opportunities to students for interacting with some of the best minds in the discipline as well as in allied fields. It has systems in place to ensure delivery of quality teaching, transparent mechanisms for internal assessment and structured preparation for University examination as well as orientation for future preparation for diverse fields and professions. To apply research to classroom teaching, an interfaculty lecture series project (ILSP) has been initiated since the session 2020-21. Furthermore, it has a full calendar of activities aimed towards making students connect not just with the literary world but also with the larger world beyond their classroom ambit. The Department has its own departmental library, a growing digital archive, as well as a rich reserve of resource in its Centre for Performing Arts and Cultural Studies (CPACS). The Department of English Co-curricular Student Society, 'ACTIVE', lives up to its name each year by organising, under the guidance of the teachers, many well attended events.

The co-curricular events include the Annual Lecture Series, Literature Festival 'LITERATI', Meet the Author Series, film-making and theatre performance projects by CPACS, various workshops and an excursion to places of cultural interest. Meet the Alumni series is a recent inclusion in this elaborate list of activities. The department also organizes National and International conferences on a regular basis.

The courses under ongoing LOCF scheme have been designed by incorporating inputs from well researched areas worldwide providing these courses clarity of course statements, objectives, facilitating the achievements of course, essential readings, weekly teaching plans and keywords. Besides core courses on literary studies, the framework of the degree also includes courses on skill / ability enhancement, discipline specific electives, generic elective and a wide range of exposure to activities associated with teaching-learning exercises of these courses. To facilitate the achievements of course learning outcomes, the department applies the model of teaching-learning as included in syllabus which clearly demarcates a participatory three pillar approach consisting of 1. Course Learning Outcomes 2. Teaching and Learning Activity and 3. Assessment Tasks. To lay theoretical foundation for the course the emphasis is on understanding concepts, expressing concepts through writing, and demonstrating conceptual and textual understanding in tests and exams. Teaching-learning activity comprises of interactive discussions in small groups in tutorial classes, how to think critically and write with clarity and discussions on exam questions and answering techniques. The assessment tasks include reading material together in small groups, initiating discussion topics, participation in discussions, writing essay length assignments and class tests. The Department, thus is a stimulating, vibrant space, providing ample opportunities for students to explore their potentials and the possibilities made available to them in the intellectual, academic, creative, as well as social arenas.

विभागीय गतिविधियों के क्रम में, प्रथम सत्र के आरंभ में हिंदी विभाग के विद्यार्थियों में से नवचेतना परिषद के सदस्यों को निर्वाचित किया जाता है, जो वर्षभर आयोजित होने वाले विभिन्न विभागीय समारोह, विभाग की शैक्षणिक एवं प्रतियोगितापरक गतिविधियों को सुचारू रूप से संपन्न कराने में अपनी महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका अदा करते हैं। हर वर्ष 14 सितंबर को 'हिंदी दिवस' के उपलक्ष्य में काव्य पाठ, प्रश्नोत्तरी, रचनात्मक लेखन जैसे विषयों पर प्रतियोगिताओं का आयोजन किया जाता है। समय समय पर आयोजित होने वाले कार्यशाला, संगोष्ठी, सत्रीय व्याख्यान से भी विद्यार्थी लाभांवित होते हैं। संस्कृति कला केंद्र, हिंदी विभाग के द्वारा भी निबंध लेखन प्रतियोगिता, लोक-नृत्य, लोक गीत गायन जैसे कार्यक्रम आयोजित किए जाते हैं। दूसरे सत्र के आरंभ में 'वसंतोत्सव समारोह' में सरस्वती पूजन का आयोजन किया जाता है। हिंदी विभाग 'शिक्षक-विद्यार्थी संवाद' के द्वारा अपने विद्यार्थियों से जुड़ी समस्याओं को साझे संवाद, सुझाव और प्रयासों से निदान करने का समुचित उपाय करता है। अध्ययन-अध्यापन के मध्य इस तरह की सांस्कृतिक-साहित्यिक गतिविधियाँ निश्चिय ही विद्यार्थियों के मानस का विस्तार करती हैं और उन्हें सिद्धांत एवं व्यवहार के बीच कड़ी को मजबूत करने के लिए प्रेरित करती हैं।

B. A. (Hons.) Journalism

The B.A (H) Journalism course aims at foregrounding the role of journalism in a democracy. It helps the students to refine their linguistic and communicative skills while providing an insight into the socio-economic and political dimensions of living in a globalized world.

A host of interesting and practical subjects like the history of journalism and printing, social psyche and mass culture, news making, advertising and public relations are covered in the course to give the student a firm foundation for a competitive industry.

Understanding the importance of practical experiences required in this field, this course has been designed to give maximum exposure to the students and thereby familiarize them with the on-ground skills and abilities required. Another crucial aspect of journalism relies on the community interaction and therefore the department regularly organizes Community Development Programs. Our students visit rural communities and try to understand their problems, opinions and the requisite needs of the societies. Department organizes talks, lectures and symposiums on various issues, which exposes students to the words of eminent achievers in the media industry. Apart from inviting media professional to the college, the students of the college are taken to various media houses to help them in becoming acquainted with the industry, its functioning and requirements.

While the course focuses on journalism and news media, it is no way limited to it. The course provides ample skills to students for varied fields like radio, advertising and public relations, photography, filmmaking, etc. And even in these fields, the course enables the student to choose their interests, be it on-screen or off-screen professions by imparting an ample skill set for both.

Event management is an important aspect of this industry and therefore the Department organizes the annual Journalism Festival 'Yatharth'. The fest is largely organized by the students with the faculty as their guiding light. Department also regularly publishes its much-acclaimed newsletter, 'MAC VOICE'. The entire process of editing and designing is carried out solely by the students, so that they understand the concepts of Journalism from news gathering to circulation while honing their skills for the news media industry.

The course's wide-ranging focus and industrial relevance is characterized by our alumni who have made a name for themselves in across various fields. Our alumni are working across the globe with famed news organisations like Wall Street Journal, Reuters, Al Jazeera, BBC, etc. While Doordarshan, India TV, Zee Media, CNN-News18 Group, NDTV, Republic Media, TV Today Network, etc. are some Indian media organisations where our alumni are proving their mettle.

Apart from broadcast media, MACites have a significant presence in print media too. Pioneer, The Telegraph, The Indian Express and Financial Express, The Hindu and Businessline, The Times of India, Hindustan Times and Hindustan, etc. to name a few.

In addition to this owing to our focus on other forms of media has helped our students to be part of radio stations like Red FM, BBC World Radio, Big FM, Ishq FM, etc. In the world of films, our students have produced award winning and internationally acclaimed films like Tremors and A Hairy Tale. While also being part of organisations like The Viral Fever, The Screen Patti, The Timeliners, etc. Furthermore, our alumni also have founded organisations like Youth Ki Awaz and The Logical Indian among others while proving themselves to be true entrepreneurs.

Leading advertising agencies like DDB Mudra Group, Mullen Lowe Lintas Group, McCann Erickson India, FCB Ulka Advertising, Schbang Digital Solutions, etc. are also home to many of our alumni. The department regularly organizes interactions of the students with the alumni so that the students understand the fine details of the industries from their seniors.

The department has a state-of-the-art Media Lab for providing practical exposure to the students to make their career in Modern Media Industry with the help of latest technological equipment in all media streams.

The curriculum for Political Science papers in B.A. Prog. is also available on the DU website.

Other departments that offer papers for Political Science students are English, Hindi, Economics and History. There are a total number of twelve faculty members currently employed with the department. The faculty has varied interests across the discipline ranging from Political Theory, Nationalism, Foreign Policy, African Politics, South Asian Politics, Human Rights, Public Administration, Indian Diaspora etc.

B. Com. (Hons.)


B.Com (Hons.) has been the flagship programme of Delhi University. Here, what you study in the classroom is directly applicable to your work life and the workplace.



B. Sc. Physical Science

The course B.Sc. in Physical Science is much sought after on account of its unique curriculum design and job-prospects. The course is designed to suit to the requirements of students willing to pursue master's course in Physics, Mathematics, Computer Applications, Information Technology, Chemistry and other allied subjects. Students are given the option to choose a stream either from Computer Science or Chemistry. The curriculum has also two major components– Physics and Mathematics. Accordingly, two different branches emerge, namely, B.Sc. Physical Science with Computer Science and B.Sc. Physical Science with Chemistry. Also, it has a component of Environmental Science as a compulsory paper. 

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ATTENDANCE

- 1. All courses taught in the college shall be taught in the Semester System as per University of Delhi Guidelines and Curricula.
- 2. According to Ordinance VII (2)* of the University of Delhi, a candidate for the Semester I/III/V Examination shall not be deemed to have satisfied the required conditions of attendance unless s/he has attended, in all the subjects taken together, not less than two thirds of the lectures/practical/presentations/tutorials required to be attended provided that a student of the Semester I/III/V who does not fulfil the required conditions of attendance, as above, but has attended, in all the subjects taken together, not less than the subjects taken together, not less than 40 percent of lectures/ practical/presentations during the respective semester, may at the discretion of the Principal of the College concerned, appear for the ensuing semester Examination; but such a candidate shall be required to make up the deficiency at lectures and practical, in the next semester of the same academic year.
- 3. Provided that a student of the II/IV semester who does not fulfill the required conditions of attendance as above, but has attended in all the subjects taken together, not less than 40 per cent of the lectures/practical/ presentation/tutorials, held during the respective semester, may at the discretion of the Principal of the College concerned, be allowed to appear in the ensuring examination provided that s/he makes up the deficiency of the said attendance by combining the attendance of the previous semester in the ensuing semester.
- 4. The assessment marks for attendance are assigned as per the following guidelines:

Less than 67% (0 Mark), More than 67% but less than 70% (1 Mark), More than 70% but less than 75% (2 Marks), More than 75% but less than 80% (3 Marks), More than 80% but less than 85% (4 Marks), More than 85% (5 Marks).

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
