



Greetings from NAACI

Failing to submit the AQARs annually, institutions will not be eligible for the next cycle of accreditation. 

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

FROM THE CHAIRMAN'S DESK

I am privileged to be associated with Maharaja Agrasen College in its Silver Jubilee year. The college logo very aptly pronounces the gist of the underlying spirit of its existence-'Karma Manav Pratipadyate'. The college which has been actively involved in pursuit of excellence not only in higher education but in all spheres including sports and co-curricular activities, is one of best colleges of University of Delhi in terms of its highly qualified faculty, meritorious students and competent staff. The alumni is also well placed in industry and society.

Maharaja Agrasen College was established in August-September 1994 as Co-educational College. It was later rechristened Maharaja Agrasen College, after a great Indian ruler of North India, a constituent college of the University of Delhi. Catering to the educational demands of the thickly populated East, the College is today attracting the student intelligentsia from various parts of Delhi and NCR, particularly the South and East Delhi areas.

The college made a humble start with two courses, B.A. (Pass) and B.Com (Hons) in a part of a school building, not endowed with basic resources at that point of time. However, under the patronage of Government of Delhi, Maharaja Agrasen College traversed a long way by imparting education to approximately two thousand students, with around 120 teaching and 60 non-teaching staff. Fully funded by the Government of Delhi, today the College boasts of several prestigious Courses, viz. Honours Graduate Programmes in Business Economics, Commerce, English, Electronics, Hindi, Journalism, Political Science, B.Sc.(General) Programmes in Computer Sciences and Mathematical Sciences, B.Sc. Applied Physical Sciences and the B.A. Programme.

Several eminent scholar leaders and institutions were associated with the college at various stages. Prof. V.R. Mehta, former Vice-chancellor, University of Delhi, Dr. Hari Gautam, the then Chairman, University Grants Commission, Prof. Deepak Nayyar, the then, Vice-chancellor, University of Delhi, Mr. Madan lal Khurana the then Chief Minister, NCT of Delhi, Mr. Sahib Singh Verma, the then Chief Minister, NCT of Delhi, Mr. A. S. Lovely, Mr. Sandeep Dixit, M.P., Dr. A.K. Walia, Mr. Rajjeth Malani, and Smt Sheila Dixit, the then Chief Minister, NCT of Delhi.

In its bid to empower girl students in 2015, girls hostel 'Vidyottama' was constructed with state of the art facilities

In an era of quantitative alongside qualitative research and accreditation, the year 2016 brought NAAC, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council to us. An opportunity to put our house in order and to put the best foot forward was the call of the day. The college rose to the occasion and uncovered its little surprises and treasure troves. The proud moment came when the college was accredited "A" by the committee. Standing tall with several renowned, established and old institutions of the country has given MAC, the great stature it has today. Instilling a sense of pride and confidence, MAC is indeed poised to scale newer heights.

As a college that began with so little; and so well, the momentous occasion of the Silver fiesta marks yet another happy beginning of many more better things to come. In the current silver jubilee year, the college is setting up eight silver jubilee centres namely-

Silver Jubilee Centre for Artificial Intelligence and Data Science, Silver Jubilee Centre for Ethics, Silver Jubilee Centre for Culture, Silver Jubilee Centre for North East, Silver Jubilee Centre for Sports and Wellness, Silver Jubilee Centre for Communication, Silver Jubilee Centre for Day Care and Silver Jubilee Centre for Academic Excellence, Talent and Scholarships.

A college is a community of scholars and students engaged in the task of seeking truth. It is a body which should administer its own affairs regardless of whether it derives its means from endowments or the state. Academic freedom is necessary to pursue truth. At the same time, the state and the society have an active interest in the educational institution.


Keeping this objective in view the government of Delhi under the dynamic leadership of Shri Madan Lal Khurana established this college on August 16, 1994 in Mayur Vihar, to cater to the educational needs of East Delhi which comprises 30 percent of the total population and 6 percent of the total area of Delhi. At present the college is temporarily housed in a school building but efforts are being made for allotment of land to build permanent college premises. The present place where the college is housed is also known in the history for the Battle of Delhi 1803 fought between the Maratha Generals and the British.

Though the college started as Co-Educational College, it was later renamed after the great ruler and philosopher, Maharaja Agrasen, the protector of a gigantic empire. Maharaja Agrasen had his capital at AGROHA near Hisar in Haryana. He was the custodian of the moral and religious virtues of the kingdom and propagated non-violence and vegetarianism. Sacrifice and self effacement were emphasized as quintessential human virtues along with truth, sincerity and self integrity. He kept alive the kingdom's religious life with devoted worship of Goddess Lakshmi and tradition of regular performance of yagnas. Built on truly egalitarian lines, the kingdom had a novel mode of establishing and maintaining equality. A brick and a coin were given to any person who desired to reside in Maharaja Agrasen's kingdom. This gave the person sufficient resources to establish his household and start a profession in the kingdom. Before anybody had heard of socialism it was practiced in the kingdom of this great social reformer.

It is only natural for any institution to be conscious of its historical antecedents but Maharaja Agrasen College is named after a

personality whose life and ideals are capable of providing real direction to an institution. At Maharaja Agrasen College, a sincere endeavour is underway to revive the noble tradition of Maharaja Agrasen's times. We look upto him to steer the institution in the direction of fame and immortality which the great ruler himself has achieved, Today's youth has a lot to learn from the great visionary A full life of versatility, alive on social, cultural, religious and academia fronts; a life removed from violent tendencies of any kind and a life of selfless service to society are virtues to be inculcated in today's materialistic and hedonistic youth India today requires value education more than stereotyped knowledge and we are lucky to have an inspirer whose ideals shall make our educational project relevant. The college offers opportunities to students to participate in various debates, competitions and seminars in order to expose them to intellectual and philosophical ideas. The college organises cultural meets to sharpen the individual talent of each student. Sports activities are also organised enthusiastically in the college. The institution is eager to create pollution-free environment around Mayur Vihar and has started planting and maintaining trees around the campus. Students are encouraged to interact with the neighbouring community to acquaint them with environmental issues. It is the institution's commitment to produce students who are fully developed human beings and not just hollow holders of meaningless degrees. At moments of perplexity we shall again and again invoke the name of Maharaja Agrasen to show us the right path and lead us to the destination of complete and perfect education.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

THE NEXT TWENTY FIVE YEARS

As Maharaja Agrasen College celebrates twenty five years of its journey of working for academic excellence, we now begin to look at next twenty five years. It's a coincidence that the Ministry of Human Resource Development is also looking at a national education policy which emphasizes that higher education must build expertise that society will need over the next 25 years and beyond. Simply tailoring people into jobs that exist today, but which are likely to change or disappear after few years, is suboptimal and even counter- productive.

Looking forward from here, the future workplace will demand critical thinking, communication, problem solving, creativity, and multidisciplinary capability. Single-skill and single-discipline jobs are likely to become automated over time. Therefore, there will be a great need to focus on multidisciplinary and 21st century competencies for future work roles - these are indeed the capabilities that will separate humans from robots. But before we look ahead let us take a look back at the road that we have travelled.

Our journey began with the inception as an institution for Higher Education, on August 16 1994. The college was first named as 'Co-Educational College' when it was set up in a temporary campus in Mayur Vihar, Delhi. Initially, we began with few courses and a small team of teaching faculty and administrative staff. Various educational and cultural events were conducted throughout next few years for all round growth of our students. The college was renamed as Maharaja Agrasen College in 1995 on the name of great philosopher and King, Maharaja Agrasen. Hon'ble Chief Minister of Delhi, Sh. Madan Lal Khurana graced the ceremony in 1995. The college continued flourishing and celebrating years of imparting holistic education in various creative ways. Year 1997-98, saw the extension of building by getting new classrooms and auditorium constructed. Many other important spaces for amenities were also constructed.

It was around the same time that the idea that education must result in the 'full development of the human personality' was highlighted in the report on 'Learning: The Treasure Within', which was published by



UNESCO in 1996. The Report argued that education throughout life was based on four pillars: i) Learning to know-acquiring a body of knowledge and learning how to learn, so as to benefit from the opportunities education provides throughout life; ii) Learning to do-acquiring not only an occupational skill but also the competence to deal with many situations and work in teams, and a package of skills that enables one to deal with the various challenges of working life; iii) Learning to live together – developing an understanding of other people and an appreciation of interdependence in a spirit of respect for the values of pluralism, mutual understanding and peace; and iv) Learning to be-developing one's personality and being able to act with autonomy, judgement and personal responsibility, while ensuring that education does not disregard any aspect of the potential of a person: memory, reasoning, aesthetic sense, physical capacities and communication skills.

India has had a long and illustrious history of holistic education. The aim of education in ancient India was not just the acquisition of knowledge, as preparation for life in this world or for life beyond schooling, but for complete realisation and liberation of the self. The Indian education system produced scholars like Charaka and Susruta, Aryabhata, Bhaskaracharya, Chanakya, Patanjali and Panini, and numerous others. They made seminal contributions to world knowledge in diverse fields such as mathematics, astronomy, metallurgy, medical science and surgery, civil engineering and architecture, shipbuilding and navigation, yoga, fine arts, chess, and more. According to Swami Vivekananda, "Education is not the amount of information that we put into your brain and runs riot there, undigested, all your life. We must have life-building, man-making, character-making assimilation of ideas. If you have assimilated five ideas and made them your life and character, you have more education than any man who has got by heart a whole library. If education is identical with information, the libraries are the greatest sages of the world and encyclopedia are the greatest Rishis".

Such an articulation of a broad view of education encompassing the holistic development of students with special emphasis on the development of the creative potential of each individual, in all its richness and complexity, has grown increasingly popular in recent years. Students must develop not only cognitive skills – both 'foundational skills' of literacy and numeracy and 'higher-order' cognitive skills such as critical thinking and problem solving skills - but also social and emotional skills, also referred to as 'soft skills', including cultural awareness and empathy, perseverance and grit, teamwork and leadership, among others. The process by which children and adults acquire these competencies is also referred to as Social and Emotional Learning (SEL). Based on the developments that have taken place in the world of cognitive science, there is now deep engagement with the idea that these social and emotional competencies must be acquired by all learners and that all learners should become more academically, socially and emotionally competent. Recognising these ideas and developments Maharaja Agrasen College conceives education in a more encompassing fashion, and this principle informs and guides our activities in relation to the orientation of the contents and processes of education.

To provide such multidisciplinary and holistic education to the students it was essential to have a larger campus. The college shifted to the new building in October 2010. Inauguration of

the new campus was done by the then Hon'ble Chief Minister of Delhi, Smt. Sheila Dikshit on October 22, 2012. With this a new era began in the history of our college. A campus with bigger classrooms, better facilities, labs, department rooms, a library spread over two floors, conference room, well equipped environment for administrative staff and a huge playground for various sports was enough to let the students gain best of all round education with innovative pedagogical methods adopted by teaching faculties across courses. Various International and National Conferences, Symposiums, Workshops and Seminars organized by different departments gave an opportunity to our faculty and students to listen to researchers, scholars and writers from a range of educational and social fields. Students Congress and Youth Parliament were other such didactic techniques for an open teaching learning environment for our students. In October 2014, Sh. O. P. Kohli, Hon'ble Governor of Gujarat, inaugurated the college auditorium named after our great leader Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel and the first lecture was also delivered by the Hon'ble guest. On January 12, 2015 the first Swami Vivekananda Memorial Lecture was delivered by Padma Shri Prof Dinesh Singh, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi, and since then several eminent scholars like Dr. Karan Singh have delivered this annual lecture. Going further on the path of giving best facilities to our students, girls hostel 'Vidyottama', was inaugurated on April 21, 2015, to provide home away from home to the outstation and needy meritorious girl students. A statue of Maharaja Agrasen, the Indian ruler and philosopher was installed in the campus on October 10, 2018to constantly remind us of the fundamental human and social values upheld by the famous king...

Larger campus and better facilities have also helped us in providing helping hand to all the sections of our society who remain under-privileged and weak. Motivational and informative workshops, remedial classes, short term language courses, basic computer workshops and many more such encouraging voluntary successful efforts were made. NSS along with its whole team of faculty and students who volunteered to play their role in it, conducted many such projects. ABHI (Agrasen Baroji Help Initiative) is one of the projects in which we have adopted a village 'Baroji' and have strived to have interaction with the people of the village for the mutual development of the college and the village. AKSHAR project has encouraged the poor children in the vicinity to attend educational classes for free in the college campus. Our diligent efforts are geared towards helping to achieve a society where equal opportunities are provided to all, with no discrimination for caste and class.

As a result of the consistent and collective efforts of the students, staff and management Maharaja Agrasen College won 1st prize for Good Practices in the 'Antardhvani' annual competition organized by University of Delhi in 2013 and 2nd prize for Good Practices in 2014. Continuing with such teamwork led us to another remarkable achievement in year 2016 when we were accredited with 'A' rank by NAAC for all round achievements and successful output exhibited by our college. This has motivated us to maintain and increase the level further and display much better results in future.

Our success story continues with our students achieving high pedestals in various fields. We have entrepreneurs, journalists, financers, bankers, radio artists, charted accountants, educationists, designers, economists and commendable achievers in this unending list of our alumni. Each year many of them come back to the college to share their achievements in life and acknowledge contribution of college in making them what they are.

We believe that education must empower workers of the future to become enterprising and creative innovators. By focusing on such broad based, flexible, individualised, innovative, and multidisciplinary learning, we aim to prepare our students not just for their first jobs - but also for their second, third, and all future jobs over their lifetimes. In particular, we aim to form a hub for the next industrial revolution. Culturally, India has been, and continues to be, a cradle of great diversity in all walks of life, with its myriad languages and dialects, with as many as seven classical dance forms and two classical music forms, many well-developed traditions of folk arts and music, pottery, sculptures and bronzes, exquisite architecture, incredible cuisines, fabulous textiles of all kinds, and so much more. These rich legacies to world heritage must not only be nurtured and preserved for posterity, but also enhanced and put to new uses through our education system. We should integrate this rich tradition with modern education to help develop the creativity and originality of students, and to encourage them to innovate. Such multidisciplinary education and 21st century capabilities necessary for the employment landscape of the future - such as critical thinking, communication, problem solving, creativity, cultural literacy, global outlook, teamwork, ethical reasoning, and social responsibility - will not only help to develop outstanding employees but also outstanding citizens and communities, in the next twenty five years.

Celebrating the Silver

The Told and the Untold Kissa of Maharaja Agrasen College

"This is a story to pass on"-Toni Morrison in Beloved (1987)

"Is this a college building? "I exclaimed looking at a not so big, a bit dilapidated shed with a dozen rooms; an apology of a building.

"Yes, it is a DU college housed in a school building" replied my co traveller and partner for many years.

"I am not applying here" was my instant reaction.

Pat came the response, "Never judge an institution by it's building. It is the people who form the institutional infrastructure and make or break an institution."

This was 25 years ago. A lot of water has flown under the bridge since then.

With a quiet prayer on my lips to serve the institution that provides me financial, intellectual, emotional and psychological succor till today, I entered the then Co-educational College, later to be rechristened Maharaja Agrasen College, after a great Indian ruler of North India, a constituent college of the University of Delhi. Catering to the educational demands of the thickly populated East, the College is today attracting the student intelligentsia from various parts of Delhi, particularly the South and East Delhi areas. Am glad to state that with the passage of time, one continues to make multiple entries: into newer domains, novel experiences, fresh minds, innovative research and thankfully no exits.

Having joined as the Teacher-in-Charge of a family of six in the Department of English, my early recollections about the multifarious activities – envisioning the vision, expansion plans, activities calendar, academic planning and futuristic projections of the college - can be summed up in one word, 'meetings'. Held in the principal's room of the first Principal Dr Ram Avtar Sharma, the six department heads would agree with me that there wasn't a day when we did not meet for a meeting to discuss and debate: the present and the future; academic and the non-academic; the faculty and the students; the old

college building at Pocket IV, Mayur Vihar Phase I and the new one, to be at Vasundhara; questions to questions, of and about MAC. What comes to my mind, cascading like shining pearls are events around Environment Day on June 5th, Blood Donation camps, Bhoomi Pujan Ceremony in 1998 and cultural festivals held under strict policing by the faculty. On the same register, new academic courses were an important discussion point.

The First Decade

In the life span of an educational institution, ten years may be just a tiny ray in the vast spectrum, but for the fraternity of Maharaja Agrasen College, this decade had been truly constructive, like a game of building blocks. The blocks have been reconfigured time and again from simple structures to more comprehensive ones, in tandem with the emerging paradigms of the techno-savvy world of today, but what strengthens it are the foundational blocks.



Turning the time machine back to nursery days, one sees a tiny seed of an institution which germinated and took roots. Small but sturdy, it grew with its youthful optimism and an almost happy defiance of all sorts of adversities. The college made a humble start with two courses, B.A. (Pass) and B.Com (Hons) in a part of a school building, without adequate water and electricity or even furniture. However, under the patronage of Government of Delhi, Maharaja Agrasen College has

traversed a long way, moving slowly, but surely; imparting education to approximately a thousand students, with around 70 teaching and 38 non-teaching staff. Defying its infrastructural limitations time and again, it showcased its prowess in academic and co-curricular segments of the educational map of Delhi.

Fully funded by the Govt. of Delhi, today the College boasts of several prestigious Courses, viz. - Honours Graduate Programmes in Business Economics, Commerce, English, Electronics, Hindi, Journalism, Political Science, B.Sc Programmes in Computer



Sciences and Mathematical Sciences, BSc Applied Physical Sciences and B.A. Programme.

Even when traversing on undulating pathways, the College with its heritage of untiring energy and self-reliance chronicles the courageous efforts of its staff and students. The institution has been producing University toppers consistently for several years now. It is a testimony to not only the dedication of the students and staff, but also to the academic discipline of the college.

It can be said that learning is no longer sacrosanct to be monasticated in a sanctuary of classrooms and library. In fact, the gestation of this germinating seed witnessed a tremendous efflorescence of creative energies on several cultural platforms of Delhi. The cultural calendar of the college opened immense possibilities for students. Throughout the decade, the college remained abuzz with one event after another. Anant (Theatre Group), Visage (Fashion Society), Promsoc (Western Dance group) and Film and Theatre society, all participated in various competitions in and outside our college.





The annual cultural festival Sharad Mahotsav, later known as Plexus with various Departmental societies, viz.- Business Economics Association, Vyakatitva (Commerce Society), ACTIVE (English Study Circle), B.A. (Pass) Association, Hindi Parishad, History Association, KETOS Society (Computer Science), Ramanujan (Mathematics Society), Chanakya (Political Science Association), TECHNO (Electronics) and Samvad (Journalism Society), provided a platform for creative thinking to its members. They organized competitions, conferences, seminars, symposia and workshops at intra-

college/inter-college levels.

In that decade, some of the renowned artists who were associated with the College were, Habib Tanvir, Upreti sisters, Raja & Radha Reddy, SK Sarkar, Ashok Chakradhar, Madhu Mohini Upadhyaya, (Qawal) etc.

Building block by block the college fostered valuable assets like a computerized, well-stocked and up-to-date library, spacious reading rooms, conference hall fitted with high-tech equipment and audio/visual facilities to organize seminars, conferences, debates, panel discussions etc; state-of-the-art laboratories for Physics, Electronics, Computers and Applied Physical Sciences; and an auditorium for holding functions.

The College Computer Centre with three laboratories was one of the largest amongst the Delhi University Colleges. The laboratories were equipped with 53 Pentium 4 computers and peripherals, connected in a Local Area Network (LAN), with all necessary contemporary software.

The Electronics Lab was upgraded and new CROs, Power Supplies, Function Generators, etc, were added for the benefit of students. A new Integrated Lab soon became functional for the students of Applied Physical Sciences.

The "Student Service Centre" provided various computer-based services such as computing facilities, visualization facilities, internet access, etc.

Students today are aware and articulate about their rights and responsibilities. In order to create an effective platform for the expression of their opinions, suggestions and grievances and also to facilitate free and fair communication with teachers and college authorities, the college made provision for the formation of a Student's Council, comprising, The Debating Society, The Theatre Group (Anant), and The

Performing Arts Society. The academic year 2004-05 also saw the inception of the Film and Theatre Society.

In that decade, several eminent scholar leaders and institutions were associated with the college at various stages. Prof. V.R. Mehta, former Vice-chancellor, University of Delhi, Dr. Hari Gautam, the then Chairman University Grants Commission, Prof. Deepak Nayyar, the then, Vice-chancellor, University of Delhi, Mr. Madan lal khurana the then Chief Minister, NCT of Delhi, Mr. Sahib Singh Verma, the then Chief Minister, NCT of Delhi, Mr. A. S.



"Dreams do come true" was what I wrote in the booklet titled "Moving On..." that we brought out then, more than a decade ago. I subscribe to this view even today. For many, MAC is a realization of dreams and aspirations. And yes, we have indeed moved on...

From then to Now

When everyone is included, the institution wins

The success story of Maharaja Agrasen College is not about one person or one year, it is the team work of extra-ordinarily dedicated patrons of the College, committed staff, and its worthy students. With Dr. Sunil Sondhi as the new Principal of the college in 2007, 'student and learner centricity' is the echo that resounds in every page of MAC. The veracity of this saying is nowhere better illustrated than in the classrooms of MAC because they are learner-centric. The thrust has always been on two-way



communication: a process of building partnerships between the learner and the learned. It can be said that learning is no longer sacrosanct to be monasticated in a sanctuary of classrooms and library. It spills over in the lawns, on the stage and in playgrounds. In fact, MAC can boast of 'classrooms without walls' as learning happens on field-based innovative research projects, adoption of villages such as Baroji and educational trips. Participation of the students in the extension activities of the college with vigour and enthusiasm has led to strong bonds between the residents

of Baroji in Mewat District of Haryana; and the experiential Learning through The Leadership Development Program, an initiative of the NSS in the college has helped students work towards the upliftment of localities in the vicinity. MAC is well-equipped with an anti-ragging cell and a grievance redressal mechanism to ensure a safe and stress-free environment for students in the campus, the college today has a proactive placement cell which synergizes the needs of the business environment and the skills of the students. Educational trips to different parts of the country provided much needed non academic succour to the creative

energies of the students.

Led by the dictum "Inclusion is not a matter of political correctness. It is the key to growth", MAC grew further by scaling the national. It organised two successful and well-attended International Conferences in the broad areas of International Relations and Indigenous and Cultural Studies. The years 2012 and 2013 brought several international scholars to MAC. These vibrant scholarly initiatives have paved way for a string of national-international conferences organized by the various departments every year totally to 17 conferences by the end of 2015 and more than 25 today. All this resulted in the college bagging the first prize in Best Practices category in the first ever extravaganza, 'Antardhwani' organised by Delhi University. 9 innovation projects (a unique faculty-student partnership) display at Antardhvani drew

significant interest from the visitors there. MAC was no longer just a new college in East Delhi. It surprised all by its youthful and innovative creative energy.

The year 2014 cemented our efforts to sustain and encourage academic excellence geared towards innovation and research by being awarded the second prize in the competitive category of 'College with Good Practices'. This was possible only because the college continued to promote and encourage research and innovation.

An efflorescence of the innovative and creative energies of the student faculty teams saw the award of 21 Innovation projects, interdisciplinary in nature, approved and funded by the University of Delhi. 2 projects were completed in 2013-14, 10 in 2014-15 and 9 ongoing projects were approved in 2015. Rs 20 Lakhs was sanctioned by Delhi University for student projects during the year 2012-13, Rs 38.5 Lakhs in

2013-14 and Rs 35 Lakhs for ongoing projects in 2014-15. Each project led by three faculty members from different departments and ten students seek to bring about real and evidence based change within the college. In 2014, the Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Auditorium was inaugurated by Sh. O. P. Kohli, ex Hon'ble with his inaugural lecture. On January 12, 2015 Swami Vivekananda Memorial inaugural lecture was delivered by Padma Shri Prof Dinesh Singh, ex Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi. As a practice today, various eminent dignitaries and educationists have been delighting us with their lectures. In its bid to empower girl students in 2015, girls hostel 'Vidyottama' was constructed with state of the art facilities

In an era of quantitative alongside qualitative research and accreditation, the year 2016 brought NAAC, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council to us. An opportunity to put our house in order and to put the best foot forward was the call of the day. The college rose to the occasion and uncovered its little surprises and treasure troves. The proud moment came when the college was accredited "A" by the committee. Standing tall with several renowned, established and old institutions of the country has given MAC, the tall stature it has today. Instilling a sense of pride and confidence, MAC is indeed poised to scale newer heights.

The college is one of the few in the university with a wi-fi enabled campus, two conference rooms, an auditorium, a contemporary media lab, sports ground, well equipped library and a girls hostel. The ICT centre makes secure and uninterrupted internet available in college and the hostel. The task of the centre does not end in housing modern equipment and facilities only but it also encourages and trains students

for using such technology for their academic assignments. For this purpose, the centre organizes workshops and training programmes for interested students after their classes.

Infrastructure is the fulcrum on which rests the institution. Physical infrastructure provides room to the other reliable infrastructure: cultural, social, intellectual and ...last but not the least... moral!



And now, the silver came!

The academic year 2018-19 marks its entry into the celebratory phase of MAC. The series of events to 'celebrate the silver' kickstarted with the Silver Jubilee Logo Making Competition in which 23 students sent entries followed by the Maharaja Agrasen Statue Unveiling Ceremony by Hon'ble Member, Rajya Sabha, Mr. Sushil Gupta on October 10, 2018. Academics was not far behind. Abdul Kalam Centre launched several short term courses for the students to ready them for the future awaiting them

As I look not too far back into my contribution in this journey, I experience a satisfaction of both, a participant and a contributor. Heading the Archives initiative was an immensely satisfying feeling akin to the thoughts of an alumna: giving it back to the alma mater. Another decade and MAC will be my alma mater! After an augmented fitter mind, the turn of a fitter body came and one of a kind, Family Olympics was organised to bring family members together, create a bonding and also to promote fitness and wellness among the students as well as their parents. Vidyottma, the girl's hostel of Maharaja Agrasen College along with Women Development Cell and Students Union organised the first ever women's sports meet, Shakti Spardha on 26 & 27 February 2019.

The first graduation day ceremony was held on Saturday, March 16, 2019 as part of the plethora of events being held in Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi to mark its silver jubilee celebrations. The Chief Guest, Prof. Sushma Yadav, the Vice- Chancellor of Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya, Sonepat Haryana, inspired the students to work harder and to realize their dreams through a culture of responsibility and sincerity.

To mark this special year, a series of inter department competitions such as Maharaja Chef, Ethnic Costume Display, Folk Dance competition, Choir competition, Skit Competition, Best out of waste and Short film making competitions were organized in March and April 2019, to claim the trophy of Kisme Kitna Hai Dum.

As a college that began with so little; and yet began so well, the momentous occasion of the silver fiesta marked yet another happy beginning of yet better things to come.



Summing up, philosophically, the first 25 years of MAC, one can easily say that from the innocence of the young and the adolescence, MAC at 25 is at the threshold of taking adult positive responsibilities of shaping the power of the youth, channelizing energies and building bridges between the young and the old, then and now, yesterday and tomorrow towards possibilities beyond...of the future. In short, can play a constructive role in building the nation.

Going by the Indian philosophical view of human life where a man's existence is neatly divided into four phases called ashrams, MAC is poised to enter the stage and state of Grihastashram and yovanavastha. The outcome of the efflorescence and the innocence of the young is a culture that processes innovations and a philosophy of inclusiveness and fruition of a vision in which we practise academics with a difference. The list of the academic achievements of our students is long; the research initiatives of our faculty cross national and international borders; and the professional achievements of the family of MAC are commendable.

It would not be untrue that MAC has successfully crossed a threshold. "There is no ladder to success, it is always a greased pole" is an oft quoted truism. MAC has striven hard with no well-defined smooth steps to climb. With sheer grit and determination, coupled with the hard work of its teaching and non teaching stakeholders, it has indeed successfully climbed the greased pole.

In the historiography of the life of an institution, the first 25 years is all but a dot; but in the life of an academic pedagogue, 25 years tantamount to more than half the life in that capacity! With this diverse dynamic in place, both MAC and myself wrote our growing up logbook together. Most of the items were filled well, and even with a miss here and a couple of incommodious entries there, today it stands well bound with pages intact and neatly written. I would be happy to share an entry in that logbook which gave me immense joy and pride then and that joy having not diminished with time still fills my bosom with happiness and pride. As early as in the year 1997, the logbook had one shining and fluorescent entry and that was the ushering in of the English Honours programme! That entry had many writers; but the fact that my pen also wrote, keeps me going even till today.





This sharing is with a difference. It is not a fact file on Agrasen, neither is it a list of achievements of MAC, in fact it is nowhere close to an annual report of our college, not even a list of dos and donts for students. It is just the told and the untold kissa of Maharaja Agrasen College.

Towards the end, here is the shortest possible letter: Dear MAC, we have had more yesterdays together than many, now we need to live our tomorrows, together...

So, lets grow together, MAC: you towards living your silvery youth at an accelerated pace, and I, beckoned by the first flushes of grey hair and a stronger pen, towards wisdom and the finishing line.























Faculty Speaks

हल्ला हो लिया।

सबने पूछा-क्या हुआ।

वह हल्लाकारक बंदा खड़ा हुआ और बोला—यहां की दीवारों पर खुदा है—सत्यमेव जयते। सत्य की ही जीत होती है। यह बात मेरे दिमाग में विकट मजबूती से घुसा दी गयी। इसकी वजह से पहले मैंने अपने बाप की पिटाई खायी। फिर बड़े होकर बॉस की डांट खायी। अब बीबी—बच्चे मुझे हिकारत की निगाह से देखते हैं।

उस हल्लाकारक बंदे ने बताया कि सत्य की राह पर चलते हुए वह बचपन में पिताजी से उधार वापस मांगने आनेवालों को बता देता था कि पिताजी घर पर ही हैं। जबकि पिताजी की ताकीद होती थी कि सिर्फ उधार वापस करने के लिए आनेवालों की ही बताया जाना चाहिए कि पिताजी घर पर हैं।

सत्य के फंडे पर चलकर कई साल तक मां की पिटाई खायी। मां कई बरसों तक अपनी सहेलियों को अपनी उम्र बताती थी—यही होगी कोई छब्बीस—सत्ताईस साल। मैं अगर मौका—ए—जवाब पर मौजूद होता था, तो बता देता था कि मां पिछले सात सालों से यही बता रही हैं। मेरे ऐसे सत्य—वचनों पर मां मेरी विकट पिटाई करती थी।

फिर नौकरियों में मेरे बॉस मुझसे पूछते थे—सच बताओ! एकदम ईमानदारी से सच्ची—सच्ची कि मेरे बारे में तुम्हारी क्या राय है। ऐसे में सत्य की राह पर चौथे गीयर में गाड़ी चलाते हुए मैं आराम से बताता था कि आप निहायत चापलूस—पसंद, बेवकूफ, लुच्चे, छिछोरे हैं। सत्य के मार्ग पर दौड़ती गाड़ी एकदम दुर्घटनाग्रस्त हो जाती थी, मुझे बॉस की केबिन से ठोक—पीटकर बाहर निकाल दिया जाता था।

मैंने बरसों के अनुभव के बाद समझा कि 'सत्यमेव जयते' का फंडा गलत है, एकदम गलत। सही यह है कि 'सत्यमेव पिटते'। मुझे इस स्कूल में सही फंडे क्यों नहीं पढ़ाये गये। इस बात का हरजाना मैं इस स्कूल से वसूलूंगा।

स्कूल के प्रबंधक, प्रिंसिपल डर गये। उस हल्लाकारक बंदे की बात तो सही ही थी। सत्य ने उसकी सतत पिटाई करवायी और सत्य का फंडा उसे स्कूल में ही सिखाया गया था। गलत फंडे सिखाने के आरोप में उस स्कूल को कहीं करोड़ों का हरजाना ना देना पड़ जाये, ऐसी चिंता में उस स्कूल के प्रबंधक और प्रिंसिपल डूब गये। तब ही एक दिव्य, भव्य आवाज सुनायी दी—यह आवाज एक मंत्री की थी, जो आयोजन में मुख्य अतिथि के तौर पर आया था। उसकी जेबों में पांच प्रकार के मोबाइल शोभायमान थे और दसों उंगलियों में दस रत्नों की अंगूठियां सजी हुई थीं।

मंत्रीनुमा पर्सनाल्टी ने कहा—हे व्यर्थ के हल्लाकारक! तुझे पता नहीं, सत्य ही जीतता है। हे मूर्ख, तुझे नहीं पता कि हर सूक्ति की व्याख्या देश, काल के हिसाब से की जाती है। सत्य की ही विजय होती है, मैं तो इसी फंडे पर चलकर यहां तक पहुंचा हूं। सत्यमेव जयते में किंचित भी झूठ नहीं है।

मंत्रीनुमा पर्सनाल्टी के ऐसे वचन सुनकर स्कूल के प्रबंधक और प्रिंसिपल 'अहो, अहो, साधु, साधु' जैसे अभिनंदनकारी शब्द बोलने लगे।

उस मंत्री ने बताया कि हमेशा सत्य ही जीतता है। सत्य के फंडे पर चला मैं और यहां तक पहुंच गया। अपने शहर के सफल नेता और तीस सालों से एमपी रहे सत्यदेव बार—बार क्यों जीतते रहे हैं। एक स्कॉलर के नाते शोध करने पर यह पता चला कि सत्यदेव हर चुनावों में दारु, लाठी, बंदूक, सुंदरी—नृत्यांगनाओं के चकाचक इंतजाम के अलावा बहुत सारे झूठ भी पेश करते हैं। सत्यदेव की लगातार जीत के मूल में उसके झूठे वादे थे। तीस वर्ष पूर्व नगर की जनता को पाइपलाइन के जिर्य पानी पहुंचाने का उसका वादा आज तक वादा ही है। हर बार इसी वादे पर वह जीतते गये। सत्यदेव की तरह के झूठ बोलने में अगर कोई निष्णात् हो जाये, तो उसकी विजय सुनिश्चित है। सो हे मूर्ख हल्लाकारी! तेरा कथन झूठ है कि सत्य नहीं जीतता। सत्य ही जीतता रहा है और सत्य की तरह आचरण करनेवाला जीतता है, इसका नमूना मैं हूं।

स्कूल के प्रबंधकों ने तत्काल प्रभाव से उस मंत्रीनुमा पर्सनाल्टी को स्कूल का आजीवन चेयरमैन घोषित कर दिया और उस हल्लाकारक को चौकीदारों ने दंड, मुष्टि और पादुका प्रहारों द्वारा स्कूल से बाहर निकाल फेंका। स्कूल के बाहर टुंकित अवस्था में पड़े हल्लाकारक ने कहा कि इस कहानी से मुझे ये शिक्षाएं मिली हैं—

- 1—'सत्यमेव जयते' का फंडा गलत है, 'सत्यमेव पिटते' का फंडा ही सही है।
- 2-सत्यदेव को जीतने के लिए झूठे वादे करते पड़ते हैं।
- 3–हर फंडे को नवीनतम स्थिति के हिसाब से विश्लेषित करते रहना चाहिए।
- 4-अपने स्कूलों पर दावा ठोंकने से पहले तमाम पुराने फंडों का पुनरीक्षण कर लेना चाहिए।

अतीत के पड़ाव और अनथक यात्रा

वर्ष 1994 में खुला अग्रसेन कॉलेज तब और अब वर्ष 2019 में क्या था, कैसा था, क्या है, कैसा है, ये सवाल अपने आप में बहुत गहन अर्थ रखता है। विचित्र प्रकार के रंगों से सराबोर यह कॉलेज आज अपने नाम की विजय पताका दिल्ली—विश्वविद्यालय में अत्यंत गौरव के साथ लहरा रहा है। यह सब मेहनत व लगन का ही परिणाम है। मेहनत और लगन उसके सभी कर्मचारियों की जो तब भी करते थे और आज भी दिलो—जान से सभी कार्यों में तत्पर रहते हैं। यह 'हैं' तक पहुँचने की यात्रा बड़ी ही अनूठी है क्योंकि जब कभी वह दिन याद आते हैं तो रह—रह कर कुछ अनकही उधेड़बुन वाली यादें मन में कसमसाने लगती है। 1995 में मैने इस कॉलेज प्रांगण में जो भी सब देखा, वह कभी भुलाये नहीं भूलता। कुछ मीठी—सी यादें, कुछ कसैली, कुछ नमकीन, कुछ चुभन वाली, कुछ ऐसी जो हमेशा अनकही रहेगी। फिर भी कुछ बात है इस कॉलेज की, गौरवशाली महिमा की जो अपने भीतर विचित्र—सी अनुभूति समाए चलती है।

मात्र कुछ ही अध्यापकों तथा कर्मचारियों से शुरू होने वाला यह कॉलेज एक संस्था नहीं, घर—परिवार की तरह हमारे जीवन में महत्वपूर्ण है। सभी आते थे एकदम समय से। प्राचार्य तो सुबह सात बजे ही आ जाते थे और पूरे कॉलेज का निरीक्षण शुरू हो जाता था। सभी अध्यापकगण भी समय पर आकर अपनी—अपनी कक्षाओं में पहुँच जाते थे। गिने चुने कमरों से शुरु होने वाला यह कॉलेज आज अभूतपूर्व सुंदर बिल्डिंग में चल रहा है। लेकिन वह भी क्या दिन थे कि स्टाफ रूम के साथ ही प्राचार्य महोदय का कक्ष था। स्टाफ रूम के बाहर खड़े होते ही सारे विद्यार्थी—कक्ष दिखाई दे जाते थे। बीचोंबीच नीचा—सा प्रांगण जिसमें सभी सांस्कृतिक कार्य सम्पन्न हुआ करते थे और उठान पर मंच और उस मंच पर बैठकर अनेक बैठकें की जाती थी परंतु आज सभी विभागों के पास भी विशालकाय कक्ष है। उस समय स्टाफ रूम के भीतर रसोई होती थी जिसमें से बहुत बार सोंधी सोंधी सी महक आती थी, कुछ खाना बनाने, की जो हम सब मिल—बैठकर खाया करते थे।

बस ले—देकर दो ही तो ब्लॉक थे कॉलेज में। एक साइंस ब्लॉक, उसमें कॉमर्स, दूसरा आर्ट्स ब्लॉक। एक कॉर्नर में रूम तो ऐसा था जिसमें माना जाता था कि उसमें रात में भूत भी आ जाते है तथा दिखाई भी देते हैं।

उन छोटे—छोटे कमरों में जाकर पढ़ाना सजा से कम नहीं होता था। गर्मियों में पढ़ाते हुए यह हाल होता था कि पसीना पूरे शरीर को सराबोर कर देता था। पढ़ाकर स्टाफ रूम में आते थे तो पता लगता था फलाँ विद्यार्थी बेहोश हो गया और तभी भागकर जाते कॉलेज की एम्बेसडर गाड़ी में उस बच्चे को दवा कराके उसके घर छोड़कर आते। मैं स्वयं कई बार गई हूँ। आज भी मेरे जहन में वो तस्वीर है जो धुंधली नहीं हुई है।

जब उस बिल्डिंग से वर्तमान बिल्डिंग में शिफ्ट करने की बात हुई तो अच्छा भी लगा और खराब भी। अच्छा इसलिए कि नई बिल्डिंग में जाएंगे और खराब इसलिए कि पता नहीं वहाँ कैसे ये दिन लौटकर आएंगे। विचारों के ताते की तरह हम झोपड़े से आलीशान महलों में आ गये। गरीब को कुटिया छोड़कर महलों में रहना पड़े तो जैसा लगता हैं कि वैसा ही हम लोगों ने महसूस किया। उड़ान उतनी लम्बी थी जितना बड़ा आसमान मिल गया था। इसी यात्रा के कई दुखद पहलू भी जो कसमसा कर लुप्त हो जाते हैं। विद्यार्थियों पर जितना कंट्रोल रखना वहाँ संभव था, वह यहाँ नहीं। यहाँ तो सब अपने अपने घर के राजा बन बैठे हैं। कहाँ 45% पर दाखिला होता था, कहाँ अब 90% पर होता हैं। आज यह कॉलेज अपनी बुलन्दियों के नए आसमान पर है। पुराने स्टाफ व कर्मचारियों की आपसी समझ ,व्यवहार, प्यार में भी कभी कमी नहीं आई है। हम सब एक दूसरे की पीड़ाओं को आज भी चेहरा देखते ही पहचान लेते हैं। अजीब—सा नाता है जो हृदय की आंतरिक गहराइयों को छूता है। आज इतनी बड़ी बिल्डिंग में तमाम तरह के कार्य करते हुए भी हम सब में एक अटूट नाता है परिवार का जज़्बा है। यही महाराजा अग्रसेन कॉलेज की नई पहचान है। उस नई पहचान में ही हम अपने नए

साथियों को भी देखते हैं और उनसे जुड़ते हैं निस्वार्थ भाव से जो अग्रसेन कॉलेज ने हमें सिखाया है और हम उसी कड़ी को श्रृंखला बना रहे हैं।

अनेक उतार—चढ़ाव को पार करते हुए यह यात्रा समाप्त नहीं होने वाली है। आज कॉलेज का जो नाम है उसमें हमारे बीते दिनों का बहुत—सा हिसाब—किताब है। अटूट प्रेम, सौहार्द, इसकी स्वर्ण कड़ी है जो हमें बीते दिनों ने सिखाया है। बहुत—सी लड़ाई, झगड़े, आन्दोलन हमने एक साथ देखे और उसके भागी बने हैं। फिर भी कभी रुके नहीं, झुके नहीं, बढ़ते रहे और बढ़ते रहेंगे। यही है महाराज अग्रसेन कॉलेज! कॉलेज नहीं यह हमारा हौसला है, जीवन है, आत्मा है, इसमें हमारे प्राण बसते हैं।

इन पड़ावों में अनेक प्राचार्य आये और समय के अनुसार कार्य करके नई ऊर्जा का समावेश करते रहे। लेकिन उन सभी में से आज वर्ष 2019 में प्राचार्य डॉ सुनील सोंधी सर्वाधिक सौभाग्यशाली हैं। कॉलेज की 25वर्ष की यात्रा में अपना समय व्यतीत किया और आज भी हमारे साथ हैं जब कॉलेज की 25वीं रजत जयंती पर भारत के उपराष्ट्रपति का सान्निध्य हमें प्राप्त हो रहा है।

अमिट अविरल तीव्र ज्ञान गंगा बहती हैं

जिसमें हम उसी गंगा तट पर रहते हैं

आते हैं गोतावर भी अमूल्य निधि पाते हैं यहाँ से
देश विदेश में महाराजा को सर्वोपिर आसन में बिठलाते हैं।

सच्चाई है तदबीर जिसकी वह है अग्रसेन,

मेहनत लगन के वासी इसका ऐसा यह परिवार,

हमेशा बढ़ा है बढ़ता रहेगा अग्रसेन परिवार

यूं ही चलता रहा तो—एक दिन ऐसा आएगा जब वक्त के तराजू पर सर्वोच्च शिखर पर
अपना परचम लहराएगा महाराजा अग्रसेन कॉलेज।

अतीत के झरोखों से

बीसवीं सदी का अंतिम दशक! वसंत ऋत् तकरीबन अवसान पर था। पावस ऋत् का उत्कर्ष यह आभास देने को काफी था कि वर्षा ऋतु का आगमन दहलीज के करीब है। झीनी–झीनी फुहारों का आना शुरू हो गया था। उन्नीस सौ चौरानवे (1994) के अप्रैल का अंत और मई की शुरुआत! दिल्ली सरकार ने पूर्वघोषित योजना के अंतर्गत पूर्वी दिल्ली में उच्च शिक्षा के लिए एक कॉलेज खोलने की घोषणा की थी। भवन के अभाव में इसका आरंभ एस्बेस्टस के चद्दरों से निर्मित एक सरकारी स्कूल से किया गया। जहाँ तक मुझे याद है, वहाँ तकरीबन आठ या नौ कमरे थे। संभवतः तीन या चार विभागों की शुरुआत हुई- हिंदी, अंग्रेजी, वाणिज्य और बी.ए.। वह परिसर घनघोर जर्जर अवस्था में था। प्रवेश द्वार अत्यंत संकरा था और कमरे बेहद छोटे। लेकिन जहां चाह है वहाँ राह है! कुछ कर्मठ पदाधिकारियों, कर्मचारियों एवं प्राध्यापकों के साथ तत्कालीन प्राचार्य डॉ रामावतार शर्मा के कुशल नेतृत्व में दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के अंतर्गत इस कॉलेज की शुरुआत हुई। विचार-विमर्श के बाद तब इसका नाम दिया गया - को-एजुकेशनल कॉलेज (दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय)। वास्तविक तिथि तो याद नहीं, महीना भी मई या जून 1994 का रहा होगा, जब मुख्यमंत्री मदनलाल खुराना जी और तत्कालीन शिक्षा मंत्री साहब सिंह वर्मा के द्वारा इस कॉलेज का शिलान्यास हुआ था। इस उपलक्ष्य में विधिवत कार्यक्रम आयोजित किए गए थे। तब मुझे मंच संचालन की थोड़ी बहुत जिम्मेदारी दी गई थी। प्राचार्य ने पदाधिकारियों, कर्मचारियों और प्राध्यापकों की अनेक समितियां बनाई थी। आज हमें यह कहते हुए फक्र हो रहा है कि जिस समर्पण के साथ उन झुरमुटों को साफ कर, समय की बिना परवाह किये, रात्रि की बिना परवाह किये, हम लोगों ने जो काम किया, उसी का प्रतिफल आज हमें महाराजा अग्रसेन कॉलेज के रूप में नजर आ रहा है। आज यहां तेरह विभाग हैं। शुरूआत में जहाँ सौ बच्चों का भी दाखिल नहीं हुआ था, वहीं आज तकरीबन दो हजार बच्चे यहां पढ़ते हैं और 140 प्राध्यापकों के साथ 50 से 60 गैर शिक्षक कर्मचारी भी कार्यरत हैं।

याद आ रहा है वह लम्हा, जब अनुशासन के साथ—साथ उचित शैक्षिक वातावरण बनाने के लिए बैठकों का दौर चलता रहता था। कैंटीन नहीं था, शौचालय नहीं था, गन्दगी का भी अम्बार था, तो इन परिस्थितियों से जूझने के लिए हम सभी प्राध्यापकों की भी ड्यूटी लगती थी। कॉलेज के पूर्वी भाग में एक सिक्रय पार्क था, उससे अंदर आने के लिए अनेक द्वार थे, हर द्वार पर हमें पैनी निगाह रखनी पड़ती थी। दाखिले के बाद पढ़ाई की औपचारिक शुरुआत हो गई थी। टाइम टेबल भी बना दिये गए थे। उत्तरी परिसर में जो भवन था उसमें पढ़ाई होती थी और दक्षिण परिसर में प्राचार्य का ऑफिस था। उसके साथ ही प्राध्यापक प्रकोष्ठ भी था। आसपास ही दो या तीन कमरों में प्रशासनिक कार्यों का संचालन भी होता था।

1994—1995 का सत्र बहुत ही किठनाइयों का सत्र था। यमुनापार के जिस क्षेत्र में इस कॉलेज का शिलान्यास हुआ था, इस सम्पूर्ण विस्तृत क्षेत्र में यह एक मात्र कॉलेज था। कल्याणपुरी, त्रिलोकपुरी, मयूर विहार, नोयडा, उत्तर प्रदेश का एक विस्तृत क्षेत्र, कोंडली, दल्लूपुरा और कई अन्य नाम भी थे, सभी क्षेत्र के बच्चों की उच्च शिक्षा का एक ही केंद्र 'को—एडुकेशनल कॉलेज'। 1995—96 का शैक्षिक सत्र धीरे—धीरे व्यवस्थित ढंग से शुरू हुआ। उचित माहौल बनता गया। प्रयास भी तीव्र हुआ। स्कूल परिसर में एक और भवन निर्माण के लिए सरकार से गुजारिश की गई। आखिर सरकार से अनुमित मिली और संयोग से छः महीने के अंदर पूरा परिसर बन गया। दो मंजिला मजबूत छत वाला मकान, बिल्कुल उस पार्क के निकट। उसी भवन में पुस्तकालय बना। विज्ञान की कक्षाएं शुरू की गई। जर्नलिज्म का कोर्स आरंभ हुआ। इसी भवन के बाहरी भाग का एक कक्ष कैंटीन के लिए दिया गया। इसी के आगे पार्क में कुछ स्थान सुनिश्चित किया गया, जहां विभिन्न कम्पनियों द्वारा रंग—बिरंगी छतिरयाँ लगा दी गई, उसी के नीचे सीमेंट के चबूतरे बना दिए गए, जहां पूरे कॉलेज की भीड़ कैंटीन का आनंद लिया करती थी।

मुझे याद है, तब मैं स्टाफ एसोसिएशन का पहला निर्वाचित अध्यक्ष बना था। साथ ही सांस्कृतिक आयोजन एवं गतिविधियों का प्रभारी भी था। टेंट, रंग—बिरंगे शामयानों, दिरयों एवं चादरों से सजाकर इस पार्क के प्रांगण को हॉलनुमा आकार दिया गया था और पूरे उत्साह के साथ 1995—96 का वार्षिकोत्सव मनाया गया था। प्रथम आयोजन अत्यंत ही सफल रहा, जिसकी चर्चा पूरे विश्वविद्यालय में हुई। समाचार पत्रों ने भी अत्यंत गंभीरता से इसे कवरेज दिया था। तत्कालीन महाविद्यालय पत्रिका में कुछ भूली—बिसरी तस्वीरों का अवलोकन किया जा सकता है। कॉलेज के नामकरण पर पुनर्विचार हुआ। तीर्थंकर महावीर की 'सत्य अहिंसा अस्तेय' का मंत्र पूरे कॉलेज परिवार में जाए, इसको ध्यान में रखकर अग्रोहा, जो हरियाणा राज्य में स्थित है, वहाँ के तत्कालीन महाराजा के नाम को ध्यान में रखकर इसका नाम सर्वसम्मित से पारित कर 'महाराजा अग्रसेन' कॉलेज रखा गया।

एक और वाकया याद आ रहा है। कॉलेज की पत्रिका का निबंधन (रिजस्ट्रेशन) कराना था। प्रचार्या ने मुझे यह जिम्मा दिया था। कॉलेज पहुंचने के साथ ही औपचारिक दस्तावेजों और प्रार्थना पत्र के साथ मै आर.के पुरम, जहां निबंधन निदेशालय था, पहुंच जाया करता था और अनेक बाबुओं की मेज पर अपनी उपस्थिति दर्ज कराता था, उनके समक्ष अत्यंत ही शालीनता से अनुनय विनय रखता था। विनम्र व्यवहार पत्थर हृदय को भी पिघला सकता है। यही विनम्र व्यवहार निबंधन के कार्य में सफलता का कारण बना और तकरीबन तीन महीने लगातार दौड़—धूप के बाद मैं महाविद्यालय पत्रिका का निबंधन करवा सका।

कॉलेज के नाम को ध्यान में रखकर मैंने इस पत्रिका का नाम ''अग्रणिका'' रखने का सुझाव रखा, मुझे खुशी है कि इसे मान लिया गया। पत्रिका तो अपने नाम के अनुरूप प्रतिवर्ष 'नवउन्नयन' की ओर बढ़ ही रहा है, साथ ही यह कॉलेज भी पूरे विश्वविद्यालय में हर क्षेत्र में उसी नाम के अनुरूप द्रुतगित से अग्रसर है। कितने ही प्रतियोगिताओं, सांस्कृतिक गतिविधियों, खेलकूद प्रतियोगिताओं, सेमीनार, राजकीय उत्सवों का आयोजन इस कॉलेज में होता है। विश्वविद्यालय के अन्य परिसरों में शायद दुर्लभ हों ये कार्यक्रम!

कुछ दिनों पहले मै अत्यंत ही उत्सुकता के साथ इस कॉलेज के गर्भगृह को देखने पुरानी नगर, पॉकेट—4 फेस—1, मयूर विहार गया था। मै विस्मित हो गया, तकरीबन डेढ़ से दो घंटे मैं उस परिसर में रहा। वह खंडहर में तब्दील हो गई है, यह देखकर मेरी आंखे डबदबा गयी। मैं अत्यंत ही भावुक हो गया। आसपास के कुछ बासिंदे से मैंने बात भी की। उनसे पता चला कि दिल्ली सरकार के द्वारा यहां तरण—तारण (स्विमिंग पुल) बनाया जा रहा है, जहाँ राष्ट्रीय—अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय प्रतियोगिताओं का आयोजन होगा और वाणिज्यिक इस्तेमाल के लिए भी उपलब्ध रहेगा।

MAC eLearning Portal, Abdul Kalam Centre: In order to respond to present day need, an E-learning Portal of College was installed and configured for college requirements using Moodle platform. All 3-year degree courses and short-term courses were created on the portal. A 10-day FDP/Workshop on 'MAC eLearning Portal and Content Creation' was organized in the month of February 2019. Faculty members attended the program and are in the process of creating eLearning content.

Young India Know Thyself (A Program for Leadership): Yet another initiative to mark this special year was the 'Young India Know Thyself'. It is a leadership development program, which is organized all over India by Vivekananda Kendra to spread Swami Vivekananda's ideology. YIKT 2018-19 was organized in Maharaja Agrasen College, with the idea of building up leadership skills in the younger generation as part of youth development. 
























The Library

The library of MAC was established in 1994. The total area of the library is of 724.4 sq.metres and has a seating capacity for 80. Seventy computers with wifi service is available. The library has more than 41,000 volumes of books and in addition, includes 27 periodicals and magazine included in the database catering to the needs of teachers and students of different departments of the college. The library houses volumes on History, Psychology, Religion, Social Sciences, Language and Literature, Art and Culture, Political Science, Mathematics, Economics and also has a good number of updated collections reference books. 






Silver Jubilee Centre for Artificial Intelligence and Data Science

With intelligent machines enabling high-level cognitive processes like thinking, perceiving, learning, problem solving and decision making, coupled with advances in data collection and aggregation, analytics and computer processing power, Artificial Intelligence (AI) is poised to change our world and presents opportunities to complement and supplement human intelligence and enrich the way people live and work. In 2016, the World Economic Forum called AI "the fourth industrial revolution" that has radically transformed the way we live, work, and connect with each other.

India, being the fastest growing economy with the second largest population in the world, has a significant stake in the AI revolution. 'AI for All' aims at enhancing and empowering human capabilities to address the challenges of access, affordability, shortage and inconsistency of skilled expertise; effective implementation of AI initiatives to evolve scalable solutions for emerging economies; and endeavours to tackle some of the global challenges from AI's perspective, be it application, research, development, technology, or responsible AI.

Centre for Artificial Intelligence and Data Science has been envisaged to address the challenges of lack of enabling data ecosystems, low intensity of AI research and inadequate availability of AI expertise, manpower and skilling opportunities. The Centre proposes to educate, train and enhance the skill set of both faculty and the students through interactive and activity based pedagogical learning methods. The Centre will provide a platform for academia and industry to build a common understanding of the capabilities of emerging AI technologies and consequent needs for skill enhancement to increase the employability profile of the students.





Silver Jubilee Centre for Ethics

Ethics lies in action. With this motto the Silver Jubilee Centre for Ethics focuses on ethics as a practice for problem solving that applies concepts and theories about what is good, right, or virtuous in real world situations, in ways that are local, timely, and responsive to facts. Practicing ethics involves discerning ethical issues and making decisions about how to act. The centre will offer study, intervention, outreach, consultation, and leadership in developing and advancing the theory, knowledge and understanding of character education including moral and ethical reasoning, moral development, ethical leadership, and ethical application. With a vision to reestablish the classical concepts and practice of justice, integrity, and responsibility in student community through education, research, and applied ethical, intervention programs, the centre will engage in teaching the practical tradition of integrity to inspire leaders of character.

The Center, through its faculty and students, shall provide classes, workshops, applied interventions, evaluations, assessments, and consultation about character education and all its perspectives to any organization, profession, industry, and discipline. It shall also be home to many people from many different expertise levels. Scholars and practitioners from the fields of Business Ethics, Communication Ethics, and Governance Ethics, shall be part of its endeavours.

Silver Jubilee Centre for Culture

"Culture is everywhere"- It is with this conviction that the proposed attempt to bring knowledge of cultural production and consumption to the college campus has been envisaged. Cultural diversity is not just a slogan, it is a very significant factor in achieving overall excellence in the institution. It will also play a pivotal role to create an environment which promotes learning between the North-Eastern states and other states by sharing best practices and experiences endorsing the essence of national integration.

The Centre intends to showcase the culture and traditions of North East by organizing events like documentary shows, exhibitions, song and dance performances, food festivals etc. It will also organize interactive sessions/workshops with experts and scholars working on the region along with theme-based events such as related with costumes, rivers, places, foods etc. of North East. Furthermore, it will plan outreach programs with various institutes, organize competitions like essay writing, poster making, collage making, painting etc. related with the North East to impart knowledge about the people and the place. It will also develop a library for easy access to literatures related to North East along with a living museum with various items of North East.

Silver Jubilee Centre for Sports and Wellness

A wellness centre has been defined as a "healthcare facility that provides scientifically proven physical interventions with positive outcomes for improvement or maintenance of physical form, promotion of body functions and health lifestyles and enhancement of beauty as perceived by the participant. The Centre is planning a first-of-its kind programme to assess the fitness level of college-going youth and identify future sporting stars. The BMI, Body fat percentage, body posture etc will be assessed. Moreover, a standardised 'College Fitness Scale' will be devised and fitness of each student will be tracked to identify and nurture talent. The fitness programme will cover boys and girls as well as differently abled youth and the module will be made available online and on the mobile app in near future.

A physical fitness-cum-health profile will be given to all students and faculty members; fitness date will be compiled and maintained centrally. Various tests like 'Flamingo Balance Test', 'Sit and Reach Test" etc will be undertake for - fitness assessment and sports skills assessment for identifying potential talent. The College will also plan to give College Best fitness award to give special recognition to the outstanding students. This will also encourage the other students to keep them health and fit.



Silver Jubilee Centre for Communication Skills

Communication plays a fundamental role in all facets of business life. Communication skills are not only needed in daily personal life, but also required in the profession, workplace and in business. It affects all aspect of the personal, organizational, professional life. In the contemporary personal and professional sphere some of the soft skills that are highly appreciated include teamwork, effective communication, problem-solving, leadership, decisiveness, time management, and flexibility. These all require ability to convey feelings, emotions, ideas and understanding to the larger public. Effective professional communication is critical in today's world. Most problems in an organization arise as a result of poor communication. Effective communication ensures a smooth flow of ideas, facts, decisions, and advice. Besides, with changing societal and professional dynamics, the communication arena has been extended up to digital mediated communication as well.

Centre for Communication skills will address the challenges arising due to lack of proper skills in communication. The Centre will work to educate, train and enhance skills of teachers and students in all aspects of communication with cultural quotient (CQ) and emotional quotient (EQ). The Centre will provide a bridge between academia and industry to reach a common platform of communication skills.

Silver Jubilee Centre for Day Care

Maharaja Agrasen College has a total of 158 teaching and non-teaching staff. Several young faculty with young children are inconvenienced because of lack of day child care facility in the college premises. With increase in nuclear families and lack of support at home, employees benefit immensely if such facilities can be made available in college. Besides, it is the norm in the urban sector for both spouses to be earning members of the family, and with lack of help at home, they are forced to look for creches and facilities outside their comfort zone. Having such facilities at their workplace not only significantly allays their anxieties but also improves their morale and work efficiency. They are encouraged to spend more time in the college and enhance their work output. They are an integral part of the institution and in a bid to extend such facilities to them, the college is setting up a child day care centre for MAC employees.

Silver Jubilee Centre for Academic Excellence, Talent and Scholarships

In its efforts to recognize and award students who have brought laurels to the college in academic excellence, sports and extra-curricular activities, a special centre is being set up to recommend policies and norms for awards and scholarships in various categories. These awards and scholarships will be funded by inviting sponsorship for scholarships/awards from sources like parents of ex-students, college alumni, college staff, publishing houses and corporate houses (under CSR).

I came to Delhi from Kathmandu, Nepal in the spring of 2005 with a set purpose: To find the voice to communicate my message to the world. I had chosen education as an enabler in this journey to self-discovery. The University of Delhi's Maharaja Agrasen College took me in.

Since my childhood, I have been using poetry to map a world where all life blooms. Today, as a journalist for The Wall Street Journal, I often navigate cities and villages of India using Google Maps app on my phone. It reminds me of my own map that I drew on my mind and heart as a child in Nepal and refined it as a journalism student at Maharaja Agrasen College in Delhi.

Here are the lines from a poem I wrote as a seventh-grade student at Manakamana School in eastern Kathmandu.

"We are not leading ourselves, but we are led
We are not free, but we are let
We are not able by ourselves, but we are made
All the things we have, do not belong to ourselves
But they all are lent
By the world, by nature and by God indeed
Who have planted our whole hearts and hut
At a single seed."

In the endnote to the above poem, I wrote: "Let's sow fertile friendship among us... and be the happiest one."

The poetic sensibility of a child in me blossomed into bohemian youth during my college days in Delhi. A poem titled "A New Millennial Youth I Sing" that I wrote in 2006 taking inspiration from poet Walt Whitman contains the following lines:

"A Human Firmament

Stretching its arms from finite 'here' to infinite 'there'

From fleeting 'now' to gutsy 'forever'

A Present in tryst with the Future

A map into the galaxy of human Life, Love and Liberty

I sing!"

For me, humanity is the name for the stream of being that encompasses everything in the Creation. There is no other. It's the veneer of otherness that we create in self-delusion that begets anger, fear, hate and conflict.

"One in All and All in One, I Sing."
It is this map of life, love and liberty that guides me today.

My teachers at Maharaja Agrasen College and my individual experiences helped crystallize this map-- the compass of consciousness. From learning the concepts of "signifier" and "signified" in the classroom, to celebrating International Youth Day in the conference room of the old college building to holding "Thinking Circle" discussion forums with friends in the college cafe garden-- all those moments from college days have left indelible imprints on my intellect and character.

Several years have passed since the summer of 2008 when I graduated from Maharaja Agrasen College with a BA (Honors) degree in journalism. I have visited the college a number of times since then to attend the alumni meetings. I have participated in more than a few academic conferences in the college and shared my learnings and observations as a professional journalist. On all occasions, I have felt overwhelmed by the warmth and affection that I continue to receive from my alma mater.

The college remains a part of me and my journey. I am ever grateful to the college and the teachers for all I got to learn and accomplish as a student.

True education is attained when the student realizes the Teacher-- a guideword for all my teachers that I met at Maharaja Agrasen College and elsewhere-- in one's own self. Then, all walls of otherness vanish. Blissful peace radiates from such Teacher-student self.

I have devised six principles to live the life outlined above. They are:

- 1. Listen to understand, not to react.
- 2. Give the gift of your full presence.
- 3. Act with patience, humility and gratitude.
- 4. Communicate with empathy.
- 5. Keep your promises.
- 6. Live your message.

To be true to my teachers is one of my life's deepest callings. Living my life in accordance with the above principles will be a proof of it.

Extra-Curricular Activities 25 Years of Cultural Evolution

Maharaja Agrasen College has been abuzz with cultural activities since the year of its inception. The earliest memories of the same are associated with working in ECA committee with enthusiasm and resourcefulness that was both passionate and raw in the earliest years. While the events and their ingredients were falling in a pattern with each successive year, there were also new additions and improvisations. The earliest name of the College Festival that resides somewhere in memory is "Sharadotsav"- harking one back to that precious annual system, where "Sharad" or early winter was the season for festival hopping replicating in the cultural microcosm of the University the Durga Pooja pandal hopping taking place around the same time in the national culturescape. Other memories, I am sure shared by all Convenors and members of the ECA of that epoch, are of working till late in the evening, arriving early in the morning, overseeing all the nitty-gritty, healthy camaraderie and enjoying the function with music, dance, skits, food and gossip. One event was perpetually endangered- and that was the DJ or the Jam Session. It used to be quite a big deal. One recalls endless evacuation of the College and then re-entry of the students at around 4 pm to hold the Jam Session. Many of us will recall being stationed at the Gate, heckling the crowds and allowing entry with a very close check of the I-cards. And eventually after all the jostling, collapsing over cups of tea and sometimes shaking a leg or two as well.

The stage was the iconic asbestos structure right outside the Principal's office, occupying a pride of place in the humble and small but vibrant and creative cultural arena of the College. Innumerable events of very high quality organised by different committees and different convenors spring up in collective memory when we recollect that stage. Today, perhaps, it is a symbol of selfless karma in the infinite theatre of the academic world. It was the College's united intention to provide the students the very best, unhampered





by infrastructural or space facilities. This objective translated into Orientation Day, Fresher's Welcome, Sharadotsav (renamed 'Plexus' at a later date), SPICMACAY events, Annual Day and Farewell. Fresher's Welcome had a segment called "Departmental events" motivating the Freshers to break the ice by working in a team to put together a performancesomething like which was restored last year in the 25 year celebrations. One has witnessed glittering fashion shows as well as choreography events on that stage. We have seen some of the best ustaads perform in SPICMACAY Virasat

events. We have seen Mushairas (2004). We have seen Alumni events (first event in 2009). And we have seen a farewell (2005, Dr. S Bala Bawa) as well. The College also performed "Dhruvswamini" play in 2005 in Kamani Auditorium. We have sometimes reversed the seating arrangement as well, with a big stage constructed in the opposite direction-once to hold concert of an Indi Music band and once to hold Annual day.

We have been fortunate to host the then Chief Minister of Delhi, Smt. Sheila Dikshit, on the occasion of the Foundation Stone Laying ceremony held on February 06, 2006 and the Inauguration of the campus held on October 22, 2012, in two elaborate functions on what today are the College grounds. In the transition period between the full functioning of the Auditorium, the College held functions and Annual Day in the central courtyard of the College which today is a green cynosure in the middle of the building. The Auditorium was christened Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel Auditorium in 2015 (inaugurated by Sh. O P Kohli ji), but has been the epicentre of Cultural and co-curricular activities since 2013. Though it took a little bit of visual, technological and logistical re-imagination of events, but Cultural Activities in the College



attained a new lease of life with more space on the Campus. Over the last decade, the College Societies have been developing and today we have 11 Societies in all. These societies comprise three theatre societies-Abhinaya (Street Theatre) Meraki (English Theatre), Samayantar (World Theatre); two performing arts societies- Natraj (Dance Society) and Septune (the Music Society); two arts and visual arts societies- Srijan (Art and Craft Society) and Qissa (Photography and Film making Society) and one Debating (Chakraview) and one Diversity society (North East Society).



These societies conduct auditions, set their targets for each year, organise inter-college events, participate in events all over India and come together in various college events in different combinations. Yuvvan, of course, is the tour de force, where they showcase all their organisational and creative skills. The Culture Council is another corner stone of College Cultural activities constituted from ever since one can remember to contribute towards planning, conception and management of cultural events. all together The Cultural calendar of the College now with the input of two committees- ECA and Annual Activities Committee features the Orientation Programme, Independence Day, Prarambh- Freshers Welcome (last year combined with Teachers Day), Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel memorial lecture (instituted in 2015), Yuvaan (renamed in 2009 from Plexus), SPICMACAY Virasat, Swami Vivekananda Memorial Lecture



instituted in 2016), Diwali Mela, Annual day and Farewell. The College won laurels in Antardhwani 2015 in various cultural events. Cultural events in the form of "Arpan" were also put up for the NAAC Committee in 2016.

The College has been blessed by the patronage of several eminent people during its various cultural events. These include: Sh. Ajay Maken, Smt. Barkha Singh, Sh. Amrish Gautam, Sh. Prof. Prof. Kiran Seth, Sushri Ragini Chandrashekhar, Prof. Lipinski, Ms. Maria Pmianowska, Mr. Pawal Betley, Sh. Kamal Sabri, Pt. Hari Prased Chaurasia, Sushri Shovana Narain, Sushri Kapila Venugopal Pt. Sukhmoy Bannerjee, Pt. Daya Shankar, Pt. Ronu Majumdar, Bhai Manohar Singh, Sushri Rani Khanam, Pt. Bhuvanesh Komkali and Sushri Sneh Gangal. Raj Rakht- a play by Habib Tanwir and film screenings of The Great Dictator by Charlie Chaplin and Making of the Mahatma have been a part of Virasat series. A Heritage Walk to the National Gallery of Modern Art, New Delhi, conducted by Mr. Argha and a Heritage Walk to Tughlaqabad Fort has also been conducted under the aegis of SPICMACAY.

The journey is continuing. One looks forward to taking the spirit of tolerance, plurality, beauty and spirituality forward in the collegial endeavour of producing socially responsible and culturally evolved dynamic citizens of India.
